

Gentlemen:

In an effort to reduce operating costs of the captioned lease by placing it on automation, Champlin and Warren American Oil Company propose to commingle the oil production with the production offsetting the captioned lease, and also being our State 32-7-33 Lease in the Chaveroo Field. The No Pit Order by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission becomes effective January 1, 1969 and by our commingling the production at a common tankage point, this will enable us to centralize the saltwater production from the leases for disposal purposes.

The operation sequence of the proposed commingling operations will conform to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Rules and Regulations (Rule 309-B). The State 32-7-33 will be utilized for the common tankage. Oil production from the State 32-7-33 Lease will be produced to its own heater treater, which will be equipped with a meter, sampler and a recording thermometer, before being dumped to the tanks. Likewise, production from the Hondo State Lease will be produced to its own heater treater, which will be equipped with a meter, sampler and a recording thermometer, before being dumped to the tanks and commingled with State 32-7-33 production. Provisions will be made to test the meters on each heater treater periodically. Gas meter runs will measure each lease casinghead gas separately before going to the sales line.
