Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated February 24, 1969, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 309-A of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Arrowhead oil production from your H. T. Mattern (NCT-F) Lease comprising the N/2 NE/4 of Section 1, Township 22 South, Range 36 East with Arrowhead production from your H. T. Mattern (NCT-D) Lease in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 7, Township 22 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico, allocating the production on the basis of periodic well tests. It is our understanding that the ownership of the two leases is identical throughout.

Under the authority granted me pursuant to Rule 309-B, Gulf Oil Corporation is hereby authorized to commingle the above-described production as proposed, subject to the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities."
