Administrative Order No. WFX-6-A

Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated January 28, 1959, for administrative approval of expansion of the North Caprock Queen Unit No. 2 Water Flood Project.

Your requested expansion was for five wells, being your Wells Nos. 2-1, 19-2, 21-1, and 23-1, and Graridge Corporation's North Caprock Unit No. 1 Well No. 7-6, whereas the order of approval which was issued February 12, 1959, covered only four wells, the Graridge well being inadvertently omitted from the order.

Administrative Order No. WFX-6 is hereby amended to permit the conversion to water injection of the Graridge Corporation's North Caprock Queen Unit No. 1, Well No. 7-6, located in the SE/4 NW/4 of Section 7, Township 13 South, Range 32 East, NMPM.

In order to avoid a recurrence of this situation, and to follow a more orthodox manner of obtaining administrative approval for expansions to water flood projects, it is suggested that any future request for conversion to water injection be made by the operator of the well.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-1053-B, Ambassador Oil Corporation has made application to the Commission on January 30, 1959, for permission to expand its North Caprock Queen Unit No. 2 Water Flood Project in the Caprock Queen Pool in Lea and Chaves Counties, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 12th day of February, 1959, the Secretary-Director finds:


1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Order No. R-1053-B.
4. That the proposed injection wells are eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Order No. R-1053-B.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Ambassador Oil Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Queen formation through the following described wells for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:
