ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-2403, Continental Oil Company has made application to the Commission on March 16, 1965, for permission to expand its MCA Unit Secondary Recovery Project in the Maljamar Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 15th day of April, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That objection lodged by the State Engineer Office has been withdrawn.
4. That the proposed injection wells are eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Order No. R-2403.
5. That the proposed conversion of gas injection well to producing well is in accord with the terms of Order No. R-2403.
6. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
7. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Grayburg-San Andres formation through the following described wells for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:


PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete the above-described wells in the manner prescribed in the application and as corrected by subsequent correspondence concerning the application.
