ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-3069, Tenneco Oil Company has made application to the Commission on September 5, 1967, for permission to expand its Grayburg-Jackson West Cooperative Unit Waterflood Project in the Grayburg-Jackson Pool, Eddy County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 20th day of September, 1967, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Order No. R-3069.
4. That the proposed injection wells are eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Order No. R-3069.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced waterflood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:


That the applicant, Tenneco Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Grayburg-San Andres formation through the following-described wells for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Unit Well No. 23 located in Unit O,  
Unit Well No. 29 located in Unit I,  
Unit Well No. 33 located in Unit K,  
Unit Well No. 37 located in Unit G,  
and  
Unit Well No. 45 located in Unit A,  
all in Section 21, Township 17 South,  
Range 29 East, NMPM, and  
Unit Well No. 39 located in Unit E  
of Section 22, Township 17 South,  
Range 29 East, NMPM.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That the applicant shall inject water through tubing with packers set at approximately 2450 feet in the production strings of the above-described wells.

DONE at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on the day and year hereinabove designated.
