ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701, Continental Oil Company has made application to the Commission on September 5, 1967, for permission to expand its Skaggs Pool Water Flood Project in the Skaggs Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 20th day of September, 1967, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701.
4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Continental Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Grayburg formation through the following described well: for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

SEMU Unit Well No. 49 located in Unit E of Section 20, Township 20 South, Range 38 East, NMPM.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall inject water through tubing with a packer set at approximately 3684 feet in the production casing in said well.

DONE at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on the day and year hereinabove designated.
