ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-3129, Pennzoil United, Inc. has made application to the Commission on August 26, 1968, for permission to expand its Pennzoil Maljamar Water Flood Project in the Maljamar Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 10th day of September, 1968, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Order No. R-3129.
4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Order No. R-3129.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Pennzoil United, Inc., be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Grayburg formation through the following described well for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Phillips "C" State Well No. 1 located in Unit L of Section 27, Township 17 South, Range 33 East, NMPM,

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That the applicant shall inject water through tubing with a packer set at approximately 4400 feet in the production casing in said well.

DONE at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on the day and year hereinabove designated.
