Dear Mr. Bazile:

Reference is made to your request dated August 31, 1993 to increase the surface injection pressure on two wells in your Eva E. Blinebry Lease. This request is based on step rate tests conducted on these wells on August 11 and 12, 1993. The results of the tests have been reviewed by my staff and we feel an increase in injection pressure on these wells is justified at this time.


You are therefore authorized to increase the surface injection pressure on the following wells:

Well and Location	Maximum Injection Surface Pressure
Eva E. Blinebry Well No. 19 1420' FNL - 20' FEL Unit H, Section 34, Township 23 South, Range 37 East	1140 PSIG
Eva E. Blinebry Well No. 20 2510' FNL - 1290' FEL Unit H, Section 34, Township 23 South, Range 37 East	970 PSIG
All wells located in Lea County, New Mexico.	

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The Division Director may rescind this injection pressure increase if it becomes apparent that the injected water is not being confined to the injection zone or is endangering any fresh water aquifers.
