TO EXPAND ITS PRESSURE MAINTENANCE
PROJECT IN THE VACUUM GRAYBURG-SAN ANDRES
POOL IN LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO

ORDER PMX-111

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION DIVISION

Under the provisions of Order No. R-4442, Texaco, Inc. has made application to the Division on September 14, 1981, for permission to expand its Vacuum Grayburg-San Andres Pressure Maintenance Project in the Vacuum Grayburg-San Andres Pool in Lea County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 14th day of September, 1981, the Division Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Order No. 4442.
4. That the proposed injection wells are eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Order No. R-4442.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above referenced pressure maintenance project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Texaco, Inc., be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into Grayburg-San Andres formations through plastic-lined tubing set in a packer at approximately 50 feet above the uppermost perforations in 13 wells as described in Exhibit A: (Attached)

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That the operator shall take all steps necessary to ensure that the injected water enters only the proposed injection intervals and is not permitted to escape to other formations or onto the surface.

That the casing-tubing annulus in each well shall be loaded with an inert fluid and equipped with a pressure gauge at the surface or left open to the atmosphere to facilitate detection of leakage in the casing, tubing, or packer.

That the injection wells or system shall be equipped with a pressure limiting device which will limit the wellhead pressure to a maximum of 900 pounds per square inch; provided however that the Division Director may administratively authorize a pressure limitation in excess of the above upon the operator's establishing that such higher pressure will not result in fracturing of the confining strata.

That the operator shall notify the supervisor of the Division's Hobbs District Office before injection is commenced through said wells.

That the operator shall immediately notify the Supervisor of the Division's Hobbs District Office of the failure of the tubing, casing, or


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packer in said wells or the leakage of water from or around said wells and shall take such steps as may be timely or necessary to correct such failure or leakage.

That the subject wells shall be governed by all provisions of Division Order No. R-4442 not inconsistent herewith.
