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CORRECTED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. PMX-174

***APPLICATION OF MARATHON OIL COMPANY TO EXPAND ITS TAMANO (BSSC)
PRESSURE MAINTENANCE PROJECT IN THE TAMANO-BONE SPRING POOL IN
EDDY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO***

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION DIVISION**

Under the provisions of Division Order No. R-9555, Marathon Oil Company has made application to the Division on June 27, 1993 for permission to expand its Tamano (BSSC) Pressure Maintenance Project in the Tamano-Bone Spring Pool in Eddy County, New Mexico.

THE DIVISION DIRECTOR FINDS THAT:

- (1) The application has been filed in due form.
- (2) Satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
- (3) No objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701(B).
- (4) The proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to injection under the terms of Rule 701.
- (5) The proposed expansion of the above referenced Tamano (BSSC) Pressure Maintenance Project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (6) The application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

The applicant, Marathon Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Bone Spring (Second Carbonate) formation at approximately 8060 feet to approximately 8150 feet through 2 3/8-inch plastic lined tubing set in a packer at approximately 7960 feet in the following described well for purposes of pressure maintenance to wit:

*Tamano (BSSC) Well No. 504
2310' FSL - 660' FWL
Section 11, Township 18 South, Range 31 East*

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

The operator shall take all steps necessary to ensure that the injected water enters only the proposed injection interval and is not permitted to escape to other formations or onto the surface.

Prior to commencing injection operations into the well, the casing shall be pressure tested from the surface to the packer setting depth to assure the integrity of said casing.

The casing-tubing annulus shall be loaded with an inert fluid and equipped with a pressure gauge at the surface or left open to the atmosphere to facilitate detection of leakage in the casing, tubing or packer.

Pursuant to Division Order No. R-9555, the injection well or system shall be equipped with a pressure limiting device which will limit the wellhead pressure on the injection well to no more than 2300 psi.

The Director of the Division may authorize an increase in injection pressure upon a proper showing by the operator of said well that such higher pressure will not result in migration of the injected fluid from the Bone Spring (Second Carbonate) formation. Such proper showing shall consist of a valid step-rate test run in accordance with and acceptable to this office.

The operator shall notify the supervisor of the Artesia district office of the Division of the date and time of the installation of injection equipment and of the mechanical integrity tests so that the same may be inspected and witnessed.

The operator shall immediately notify the supervisor of the Artesia district office of the Division of the failure of the tubing, casing or packer in said well and shall take such

steps as may be timely and necessary to correct such failure or leakage.

The subject well shall be governed by all provisions of Division Order No. R-9555, as amended and Rules 702-706 of the Division Rules and Regulations not inconsistent herewith.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT, jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Division for the entry of such further order or orders as may be deemed necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of the operator to conduct operations in a manner which will ensure the protection of fresh water or in a manner inconsistent with the requirements set forth in this order, the Division may, after notice and hearing, terminate the injection authority granted herein.
