A copy of the docket will be mailed to you within the next few days.



I have irrigation wells just  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile & less due east of said well & I fear for the contamination of these wells. I will realize that if properly handled no water will get into the fresh water zone, but I have a well now that is in northern Lea that has turned salty. I don't know the source but there is a salt water well just southwest of the contaminated well that I suspect. So for this reason I am protesting the granting of the above mentioned well.
