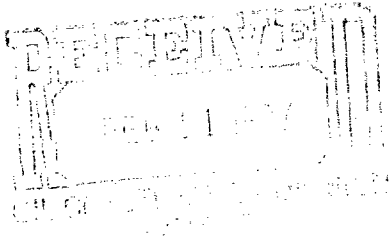

Filter Backwash fluid from water flood filters.

Discussion

Question: Does oil field exemption to RCRA include filter backwash fluid from injection filters in a waterflood operation. Filters are filtering out solids from produced water prior to injection into waterflood. Produced water is used to back flush these filters for cleaning. The backwash fluid is then commingled with excess produced water and disposed of in class II disposal well.

Conclusions or Agreements

Stephanie's answer: If fluid is only produced water and not commingled with any other waste stream (Refinery waste, etc) then it is exempt and can be disposed down class II well.
