Reference is made to your application dated May 4, 1972, for an exception to Rule 309-A of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit off-lease storage for North Vacuum-Abo production from that portion of your Santa Fe Lease described as the E/2 NE/4 of Section 19, Township 17 South, Range 35 East, Lea County, New Mexico. It is our understanding that this production would be handled in a separate tank battery to be located on another segment of your Santa Fe Lease in the SE/4 SW/4 of Section 20, immediately east.

Pursuant to the authority granted me by Rule 309-C, Phillips Petroleum Company is hereby authorized off-lease storage as described above, provided that there shall be no intercommunication of the handling, separating, treating or storage facilities designated to each lease.

Gentlemen:

We respectfully request administrative action under Statewide Rule 309-C to grant us an exception to Statewide Rule 309-A which will allow us to use off lease storage and casinghead gas measuring facilities to serve North Abo production on a portion of our Santa Fe Lease--further described as State Lease No. B-2073--E/2 NE/4 Section 19, T-17-S, R-35-E, Lea County, New Mexico. The location of these facilities is to be in Unit N, on a separate segment of our Santa Fe Lease--State Lease No. B-2388--W/2 SE/4 and E/2 SW/4 Section 20, T-17-S, R-35-E, Lea County, New Mexico. Santa Fe No. 122 is drilling on Lease No. B-2073, and we will request that the Vacuum, North Abo Field be extended to include this area.

The location of the proposed facilities is adjacent to other like installations serving other formations on the Santa Fe Lease. There would be no intercommunication of the handling, separating, treating, or storage facilities with any of the installations currently operating. Full working interests in the two leases are common to Phillips, and royalty on these tracts is common to the state which has approved this proposal by letter dated April 25, 1972--copies of which are attached.




