Administrative Order OLS-19

Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your letter of October 23, 1963, wherein you request administrative approval of an exception to Rule 309-A to permit the off-lease storage of oil produced from your Harris Lease comprising the SW/4 NW/4 of Section 33, Township 6 South, Range 16 East, Chaves County, New Mexico.

It is our understanding that you wish to locate the tank battery for this well some 3500 feet to the West in the SE/4 NW/4 of Section 32, to be out of the Pecos River bottom-land.

Pursuant to the authority vested in me by Rule 309-C of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized the off-lease storage outlined above, provided however, that there shall be no intercommunication of the treating, handling, or storage facilities for this and any other production.


Re: Tank Battery off the 40
acre drill sit location

Dear Sirs:

As per instructions from your Artesia office we here by request approval to locate the tank battery for the Burleson and Huff Harris No. 1, San Andres producer in section 33, T-6-S, R-26-E, Chaves County, some 3500 feet west of the producing well head. The enclosed Exhibit is a plat of the area showing the location of the well and our proposed location of the tank battery. The battery is located in unit F of section 32. You will notice that the Harris No. 1 was drilled in the Pecos River bottom land as shown in red on the enclosed Exhibit. This area is sand and salt ceders and is impassable to heavy oil trucks. Also a loaded oil truck could not climb the very steep hill at the high bank some 3500 feet west of the Harris No. 1 well.

Since this area is subject to flood from the river and impassable to oil trucks we request permission to put our battery for the Harris No. 1 some 3500 feet west of the well which will place the battery our of the river bed and on the west edge of the high bank. This will enable us to haul the oil from this producing well.


