Dear Sir:

Pan American Petroleum Corporation submits application for the commingling of oil production from the following wells and pools:

State "CK" No. 1 located Unit N, Section 19, T-21-S, R-37-E, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. This well is dual completed in the Drinkard (oil) and Paddock (oil) Pools.

State "CK" No. 2 located Unit K, Section 19, T-21-S, R-37-E, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. This well is triple completed in the Drinkard (oil), Blinebry (oil) and Paddock (oil) Pools.

State "CK" No. 3 located Unit N, Section 19, T-21-S, R-37-E, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. This well is dual completed in the Blinebry (oil) and Penrose Skelly (oil) Pools. Application for dual completion submitted through administrative channels February 8, 1963.

In support of our request for exception approval without notice and hearing to Rule 303 (a), to permit the commingling in common facilities of the commonly owned production from two or more common sources

of supply, the following is submitted:

1. Oil production from the Paddock, Blinebry and Drinkard Pools is presently commingled with the Paddock and Drinkard Pool production and is measured separately utilizing A. O. Smith T-6 temperature compensated meters equipped with samplers. The production from the Blinebry is determined by the subtraction method. Administrative approval for the commingling of Paddock, Blinebry and Drinkard Pools was granted July 31, 1962, Administrative Order PC-73. The oil production from the Penrose Skelly will be measured by an A. O. Smith T-6 temperature compensated meter equipped with a sampler. The oil production from the Blinebry will be determined by the subtraction method.
2. A B. S. & W. reading will be taken every eight days and the production from each zone recorded.
3. Testings of each source of supply will be performed by shutting in all but one well and testing.
4. The A. O. Smith T-6 meters will be proved monthly in the existing 500 bbl. stock tanks.
5. Detailed data of liquid hydrocarbons:

C. Commingled Production	38.5	2.91	113,840

The commercial value of the commingled production will be greater than the sum of the production from each common source of supply by approximately \$788 per year.




SCALE:


