Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated February 8, 1963, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of the distillate production from the Blanco-Mesaverde and the Basin-Dakota Pools from your Breech "E" Well No. MD-58, located in Unit A of Section 3, Township 26 North, Range 6 West, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, allocating the production to each pool on the basis of periodic well tests.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the distillate production from the afore-said pools from said well in the above-described manner. Provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities."
