


Gentlemen:

Reference is made to Oil Conservation Commission Administrative Orders PC-171 and PLC-10. Administrative Order PC-171 authorizes the commingling of production from the Abo and Glorieta pools on our State "T" Lease, while PLC-10 authorizes the commingling of Abo production from our State "V" and State "W" Leases with Glorieta production from our State "V" Lease. These three leases are in the Vacuum Field, located in T17S, R35E, Lea County, New Mexico.

Effective February 1, 1967, all Abo production on the above leases was transferred to the Vacuum Abo Unit and subsequently handled in Unit production facilities. Therefore, Shell Oil Company wishes to notify the Commission that Abo and Glorieta production will no longer be commingled on these leases. Since only Glorieta production from the State "T" and State "V" leases remains and production from each lease will be handled separately, we intend to discontinue the separate metering of the Glorieta production.

The commingling of San Andres and Yates production on the State "V" Lease will remain unchanged and continue operation in accordance with Oil Conservation Commission rules and regulations.
