AMENDMENT

Administrative Orders PC-188 and PC-223

Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your letter dated September 27, 1966, wherein you request an amendment to Administrative Order PC-188, which authorized the commingling of Blinbry and San Andres production on your Swigart Lease after metering the Blinbry production and determining the San Andres production by means of the subtraction method, and an amendment to Administrative Order PC-223, which authorized the commingling of Glorieta and San Andres production on your State H Lease after separately metering the Glorieta production and determining the San Andres production by means of the subtraction method. It is our understanding that in order to facilitate production handling on these leases and decrease the time requirements of your field personnel, that you wish to revise the installations to allow metering and sampling of the San Andres production and determination of the Glorieta and Blinbry production in the respective installations by means of the subtraction method.

WATER CONSERVATION

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Water conservation is a subject of increasing importance in these days of rapid population growth and increasing demand for water. The Commission of the Land Office has been studying this subject for some time, and has now prepared this report on the subject of water conservation. The report is divided into two parts, one dealing with water conservation in general, and the other dealing with water conservation in the State of New Mexico. The first part of the report deals with the general principles of water conservation, and the second part deals with the specific measures which should be taken in the State of New Mexico to conserve water. The report is based on a study of the water resources of the State, and on a survey of the water conservation practices of other States. The report is intended to serve as a guide for the State of New Mexico in its efforts to conserve water.

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Inasmuch as the production from each pool in both of the installations is sour and has a similar gravity range, and no change in revenue is anticipated, Administrative Orders PC-188 and PC-223 are hereby amended as described above.
