Gentlemen:

Administrative Order PC-232, dated September 24, 1964, provides for the commingling of State "S" Lease production from the Drinkard and Blinebry Oil Pools. Drinkard production is metered and the Blinebry production is determined by the subtraction method.

We respectfully request that Order PC-232 be amended to provide for pool commingling without the metering of production.

The wells are physically incapable of producing top unit allowable from their respective pools. See Attachment I.

Periodic well tests will be conducted and be used as a basis for allocating production to each well and pool. Schematic of the proposed facility is on Attachment II.

State "S" Lease is comprised of the N/2 NW/4 and SW/4 NW/4 of Section 32, T-22-S, R-38-E, Lea County, New Mexico as depicted on Attachment III.

There is no diversity of ownership between zones on this lease.

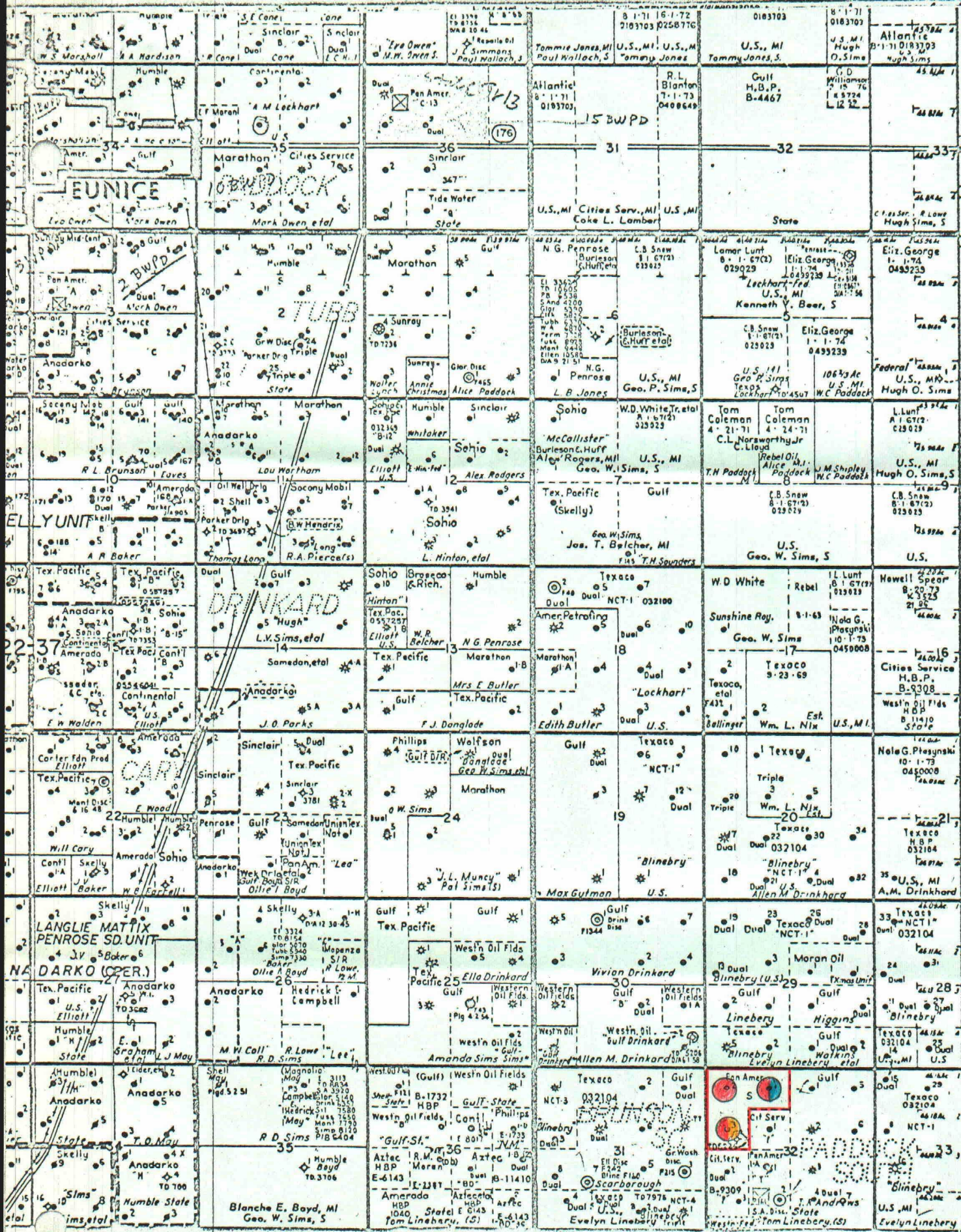
- #1. Well No. 1 - BLINEBRY
