Reference is made to your application dated March 2, 1965, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of oil produced from the Drinkard and Blinebry Oil Pools and gas well liquids from the Tubb and Blinebry Gas Pools on your Lockhart A-27 Lease comprising the N/2 of Section 27, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico, after separately metering the production from the Drinkard, Blinebry Gas, and Tubb Gas Pools and determining the Blinebry oil production by means of the subtraction method.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above-described manner. Provided, however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," including the provision for non-reset counters on the meters, and provided further, that you shall notify the Hobbs District Office of the Commission at such time as this installation is complete in order that an inspection may be made of the installation prior to putting it in operation.
