
Dear Sir:

Oil Conservation Commission Administrative Order PC-263 dated May 24, 1965, approved the commingling of the Elinebry, Tubb-Drinkard, Fusselman, and Montoya production on Sinclair Oil & Gas Company's Wimberly WN Lease in Sections 23 and 24, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, Justis Field, Lea County, New Mexico, after separately metering of the Elinebry and Fusselman production and determining the Montoya and Tubb Drinkard production by the subtraction method. At the time of the order the Elinebry and Fusselman zones both had wells capable of top allowable and the Montoya and Tubb Drinkard zones wells were all marginal.

One well in the Tubb Drinkard formation has been worked over and is now capable of producing top allowable. The wells in the Montoya formation all remain marginal. A meter has been placed on the Tubb Drinkard formation to meter it in addition to metering the Elinebry and Fusselman zones. This will have us metering the three zones which have wells capable of top allowable and the one zone, the Montoya, on which all wells are marginal will not be metered.

As of this date, we have not yet commenced the commingling of production on this lease, however, our installation of lines and equipment is almost completed and the Hobbs District Office of the Commission will be notified when the installation is completed in order that an inspection can be made prior to putting it into operation.
