AMENDMENT

Administrative Order PC-282

Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your letter dated July 27, 1966, wherein you request an amendment to Administrative Order PC-282 which, as amended, authorized the commingling of Drinkard, Blinebry, and Tubb oil on your State "C" Tract 13 Lease in Section 36, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico, after separately metering the production from each pool. It is our understanding that you now also have Wantz-Abo oil and Tubb condensate production on the subject lease which you wish to include in the commingling installation. Further, that all production on said lease is of marginal nature and that you wish the provision for requirement of separate measurement deleted from the order.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle Blinebry oil, Drinkard oil, Tubb oil, Wantz-Abo oil, and Tubb condensate production on the subject State "C" Tract 13 Lease, allocating the production on the basis of periodic well tests. Provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," and provided further, that you shall notify the Commission at such time as any well in any of the aforesaid pools is capable of top allowable production.
