Gentlemen:

P Reference is made to your recent applications for administrative authority to commingle Dakota and Mesaverde condensate produced from several wells in Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, allocating the condensate production, if any, back to each zone in each well on the basis of semiannual gas-liquid tests to be reported on Commission Form C-116. It is our understanding that the ownership of each zone in each well is common.

Y Tenneco Oil Company is hereby authorized to commingle the Dakota and Mesaverde condensate in the above-described manner which is produced from the following wells:
