Dear Sir:

Gulf is daily completing its R. E. Cole (NCT-A) No. 8 in the Silurian and Montoya pools and proposes to commingle production from these pools with the Brunson production from Well No. 7 (the only Brunson well on the lease). Utilization of the existing Brunson tank battery facilities will save a capital investment expenditure of approximately \$20,000.00.

Attached is a plat of the area involved, a copy of the letter from Shell Oil Company agreeing to purchase the commingled crude, and a schematic diagram of the proposed installation. We have applied for approval of this proposal to the State Land Commissioner and requested that he notify you of his decision.

The following tabulation shows the volumes, gravities and monetary value of the oil from the individual pools as well as the commingled production:

The value of the commingled production will be \$1.62/day more than the sum of the values of the individual oils.

A development program is underway in the Silurian and Montoya pools, thus we will want to add this future production to the commingled battery also.

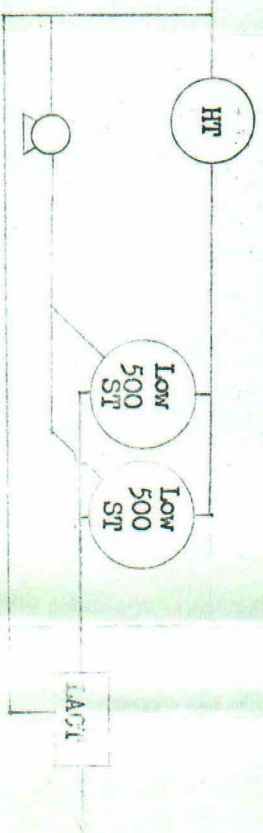
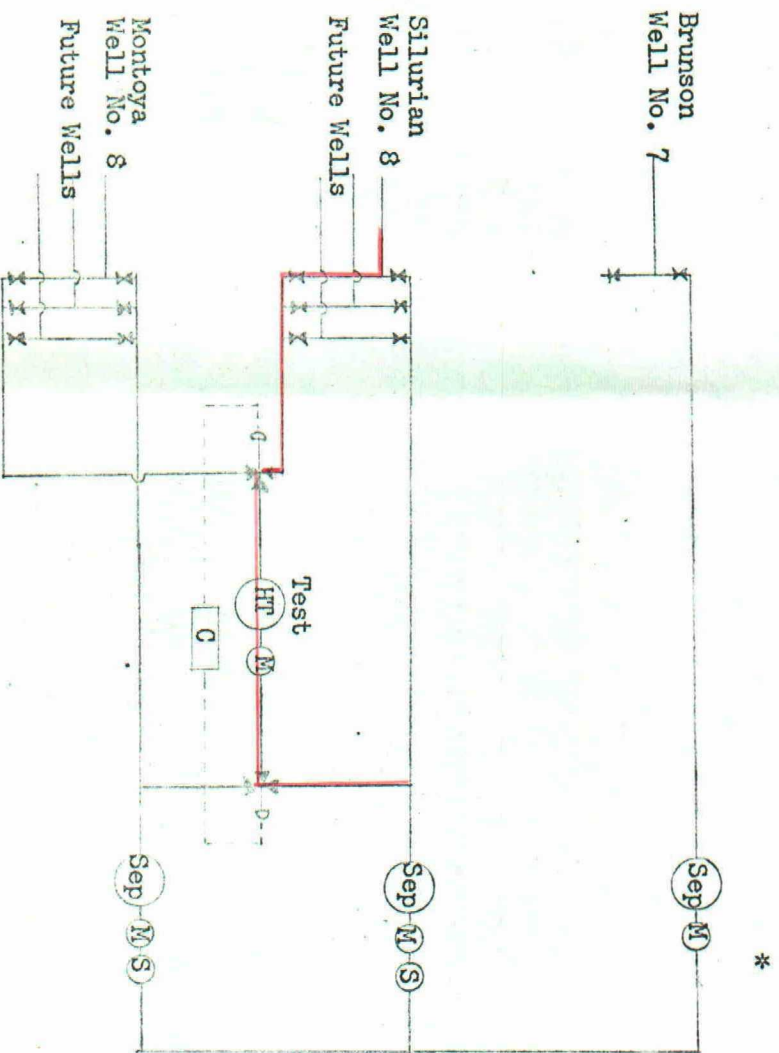

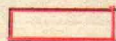
