Texas Pacific Oil Company respectfully requests administrative approval of exception to Rule 303(b), to permit the commingling of production from the Ellenburger-Joins and Granite Wash formations in the East Brunson Pool.

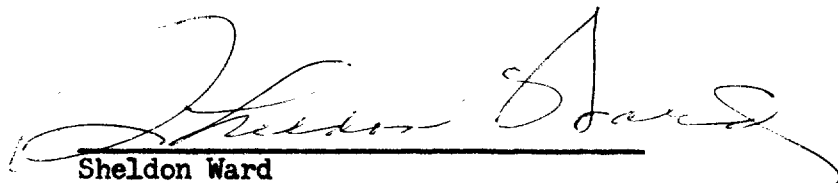
In support of this request the following information is presented for your consideration:

1. The Ella Drinkard Lease consists of 160 acres being the SW/4, NW/2 of NW/4 and NW/4 of SW/4 of Sec. 25, T-22-S; R-37-E.
2. Ownership for both zones is identical.
3. The commercial value of the commingled production will be the same value of the production from each of the separate zones.
4. Commingling facilities will utilize the subtraction method and will be in accordance with applicable provisions of the "Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities".
5. At present there is one producing oil well on this lease, the Ella Drinkard Well No. 2 which is an Ellenburger-Joins and Granite Wash dual completion. Any additional wells completed in these zones will be added to the system.

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6. Attached is a schematic of the proposed commingling system and a plat of the lease.
7. The allowable will be 126 BOPD for the Ellenburger-Joins and 126 BOPD for the Granite Wash. The Ellenburger-Joins has a measured gravity of 37.1 API at 60° F. and the Granite Wash 39.1 API at 60° F.

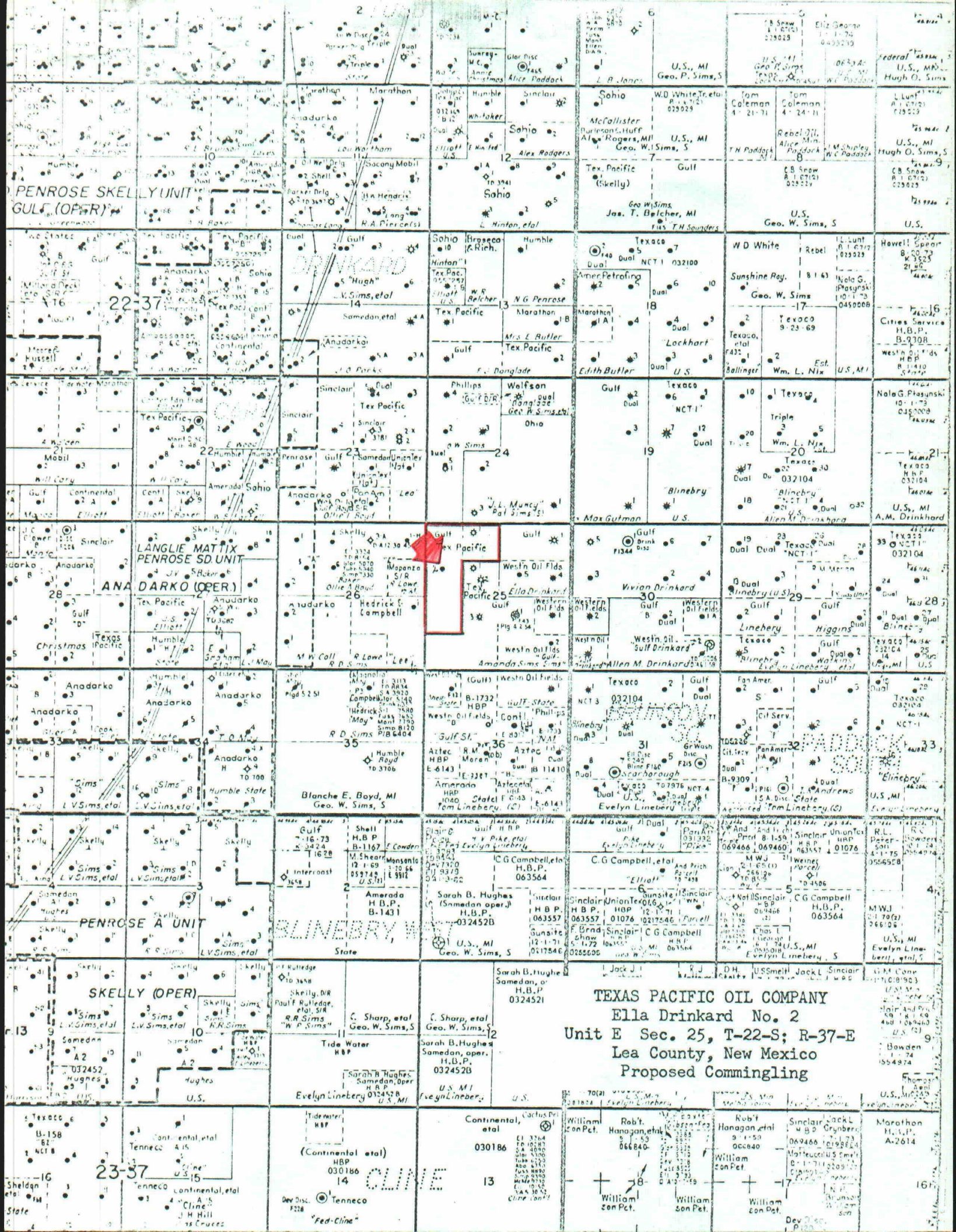

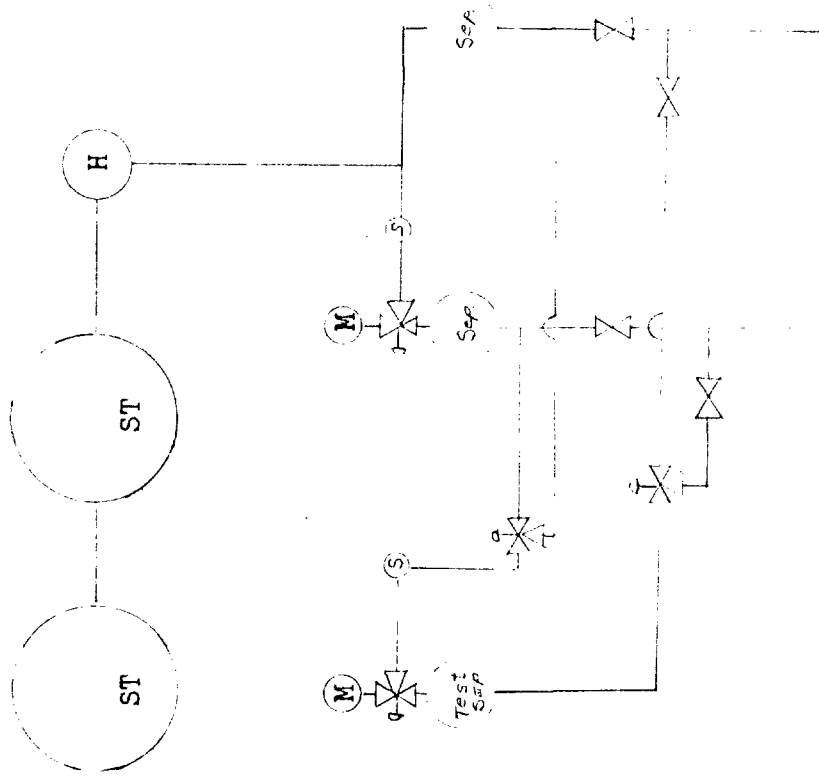
