**Gentlemen:**

Reference is made to your applications dated January 5, 1968, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pool and Basin-Dakota Gas Pool liquids from certain of your wells in San Juan and Rio Arriba Counties, New Mexico, allocating condensate production back to each zone on the basis of semi-annual gas-liquid ratio tests.

Pursuant to the authority given me by Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, Tenneco Oil Company is hereby authorized to commingle the liquid production from the Blanco-Mesaverde and Basin-Dakota Gas Pools from each of the following-described wells:
