**Gentlemen:**

Reference is made to your application dated May 7, 1968, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Tubb and East Brunson-Ellenburger production on your Sims Lease comprising the NW/4 and W/2 SW/4 of Section 24, Township 22 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico, allocating the production on the basis of periodic well tests. It is our understanding that the production from both pools on said lease is of marginal nature.

By the authority vested in me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above-described manner, provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," and provided further, that you shall notify the Commission at such time as any well in either of the aforesaid pools is capable of top allowable production.

Reference is made to your application dated May 17, 1967, for  
with a view to the approval of an exception to Rule 13 (a) of the Oil  
Control Commission to permit the transportation of oil  
from the State of New Mexico to the State of Texas  
for the purpose of being sold in the State of Texas.  
The Commission has considered your application and the  
information furnished in connection therewith and has  
concluded that the proposed transportation of oil  
from the State of New Mexico to the State of Texas  
is in the public interest and that the proposed  
transportation of oil from the State of New Mexico  
to the State of Texas is in the public interest.

It is the order of the Commission that you may  
transport oil from the State of New Mexico to the  
State of Texas for the purpose of being sold in  
the State of Texas, provided that you comply with  
the provisions of Rule 13 (a) of the Oil Control  
Commission and that you file with the Commission  
a copy of the proposed transportation contract and  
a copy of the proposed transportation bill of lading  
for each shipment of oil transported from the State  
of New Mexico to the State of Texas.
