Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application dated April 29, 1969, for administrative approval of an exception to Rule 303 (a) of the Commission Rules and Regulations to permit the commingling of Blinbry and San Andres production from your State "A" Lease comprising the S/2 NE/4 of Section 32, Township 18 South, Range 38 East, Hobbs Field, Lea County, New Mexico, after separately metering the Blinbry oil and determining the San Andres production by means of the subtraction method.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 303 (b) of the Commission Rules and Regulations, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools on said lease in the above-described manner, provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities," including the requirement for non-reset counters on the meters and provided further, that you shall notify the Hobbs District Office of the Commission at such time as the installation is complete in order that an inspection may be made thereof.
