
Dear Sir:

Amerada Petroleum Corporation is owner and operator of the 160 acre (State "Q") lease described as the SE/4 of section 16, T-20S, R-37E. The lease contains two Grayburg and two Tubb completions. The State "Q" No. 1 is a dual completion, the No. 2 is a Grayburg completion, and the No. 4 is a Tubb completion.

By New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Order No. R-1460, dated August 7, 1959, we were permitted to commingle the Monument Grayburg-San Andres and the Tubb production by metering.

We respectfully request administrative authority to commingle without metering as none of the completions produce the top allowable. Average production for the last 60 days is as follows: State "Q" No. 1-T, Monument Grayburg-San Andres, 15 BOPD; State "Q" No. 2, Monument Grayburg-San Andres, 27 BOPD; State "Q" No. 1-C, Tubb, temporarily abandoned; State "Q" No. 4, Tubb, 25 BOPD.
