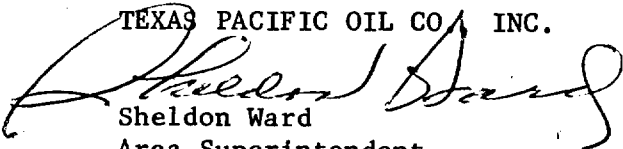
Texas Pacific Oil Co., Inc. respectfully requests administrative approval of exception to Rule 303 "Segregation of Production from Pools" to permit the commingling of production on the captioned lease.

We are presently drilling Eaton S. E. Well No. 12 as a Justis Blinebry and Tubb Drinkard oil-oil dual. It is requested that these two zones be allowed to produce this commonly owned production into a common tank battery as shown on the attached schematic diagram. Commingling will be by the subtraction method and will be in accordance with all applicable provisions of the New Mexico O.C.C. "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities."

The expected average gravity is 38.5 from the Blinebry and 37.0 from the Tubb Drinkard. We do not expect any change in the value of the hydrocarbons of the commingled production.

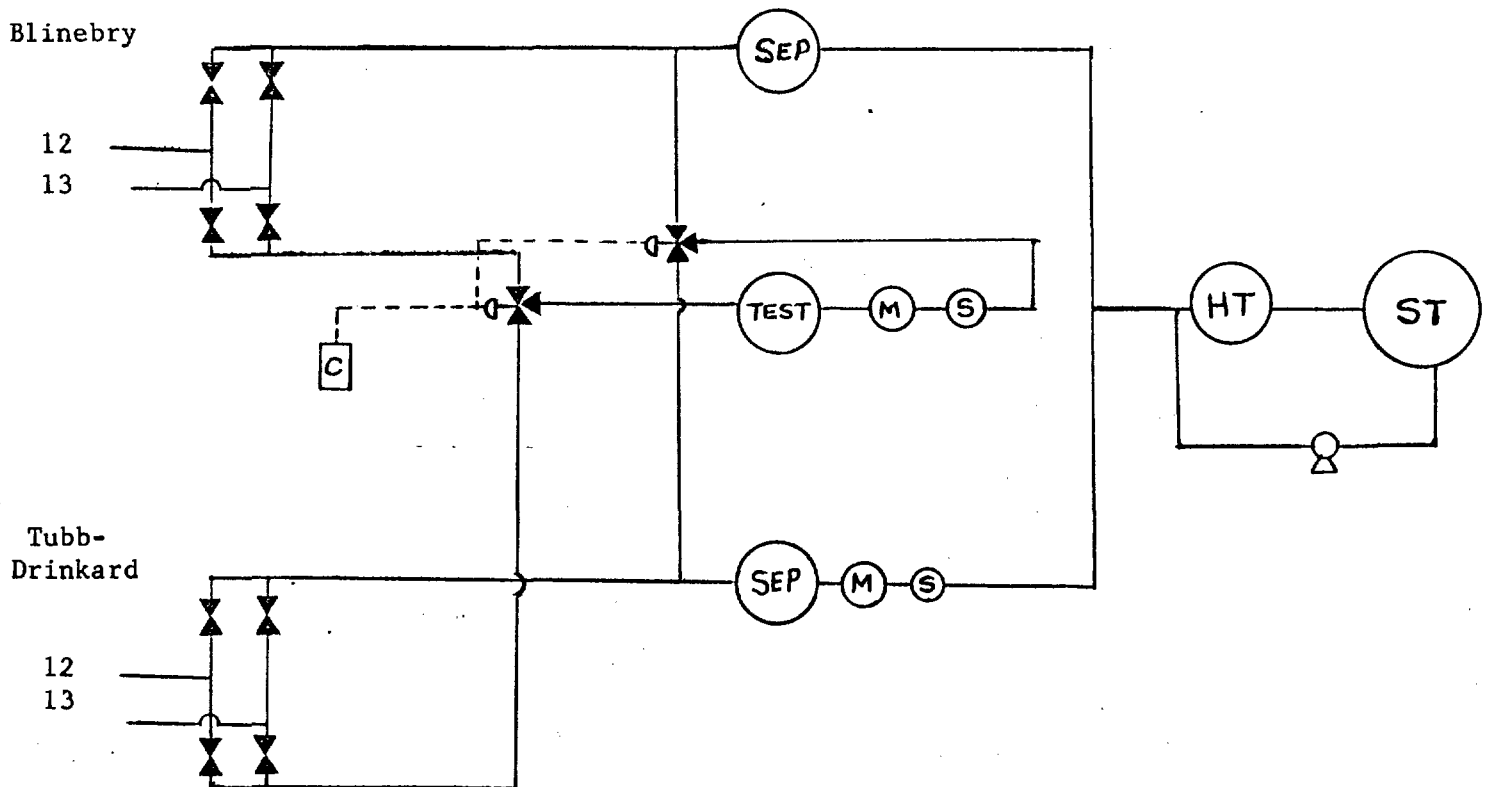
