



Reference is made to your application for approval to commingle gas production from your wells Nos. 1 and 2 Kinsale, sec. 26, T. 23 N., R. 7 W., Lease No. NM-28748. Federal regulations do not require formal approval for combining of production at the surface from two or more zones on a single Federal or Indian lease if royalty rates for all producing zones are identical and gravity and crude oil types are fairly similar.
