Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your recent request for the amendment of Order No. R-1804 which authorized the commingling of Eumont and Eunice production from your State "F", State "G", State "L", and State "M" Leases in Sections 1, Township 21 South, Range 35 East, and 6, Township 21 South, Range 36 East, Lea County, New Mexico. As stated in your letter of July 20, 1970, and further clarified by telephone conversations between this office and your office, it is our understanding that your State "G" Lease has been sold and your State "F" Lease has been temporarily abandoned since 1964, and that you now have only the State "L" and State "M" Leases on production and that they are still producing from the Eunice and Eumont Pools. Further, that the production from all wells on both leases in both pools is of marginal nature and that you therefore propose to commingle said production, allocating on the basis of periodic well tests.

Pursuant to the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 303-B and Rule 309-B of the Commission Rules and Regulations, Shell Oil Company is hereby authorized to commingle the production from the aforesaid pools and leases in the above-described manner, provided however, that the installation shall be operated in accordance with the Commission "Manual for the Installation and Operation of Commingling Facilities." 


