Gentlemen:

Cities Service Oil and Gas Corporation respectfully requests permission to commingle Queen production from the subject leases in a common tank battery. In support of this request, the following information is submitted for your consideration:

Corbin Queen

1. All production from these leases is currently from the Queen formation at an approximate depth of 4220 feet.
2. Adequate well testing facilities will be provided to accurately determine the production from each well at reasonable intervals.
3. Cities Service Oil and Gas Corporation is the lessee of record of the federally owned minerals under the subject leases. No other parties own a working interest in either of these leases.
4. The crude purchaser is being notified, by copy of this letter, of our intention to commingle Queen production from these leases.
5. The hydrocarbon production from each of the subject leases will be accurately measured and determined prior to commingling in a common tank battery.
6. The proposed commingling facilities will adhere to the site security requirements of Federal Onshore Oil and Gas Order No. 1 under 43 CFR 3162.7.


Please find attached a plat of the subject leases showing the wells on these leases and the formations in which they are completed. Also attached is a schematic diagram of the proposed commingling facilities.


