RE: Kemnitz Wolfcamp
and Kemnitz Cisco
Surface Commingling

Dear Sir:

Approval is requested for an exception to Rule 303-A to permit surface commingling of the Kemnitz Wolfcamp and the Kemnitz Cisco oil production into common production facilities. Oil production from both the Wolfcamp and Cisco formations has been determined prior to commingling. Oil production from both zones will be accurately monitored through test facilities on a monthly basis.

The following information has been determined for both the Cisco and Wolfcamp oil production:

<u>Zone</u>	<u>Production</u>	<u>API Gravity</u>
Wolfcamp	180 BOPD	37.50
Cisco	30 BOPD	35.40
~15% Cisco/85% WC	210 BOPD (Total)	37.00

The actual commercial value of the commingled production will not be less than the sum of the values of production from the Cisco and Wolfcamp. Attached please find a plat showing the location of all wells on TOC's Kemnitz lease including the pool from which each well produces. Also find a schematic of the production facility.

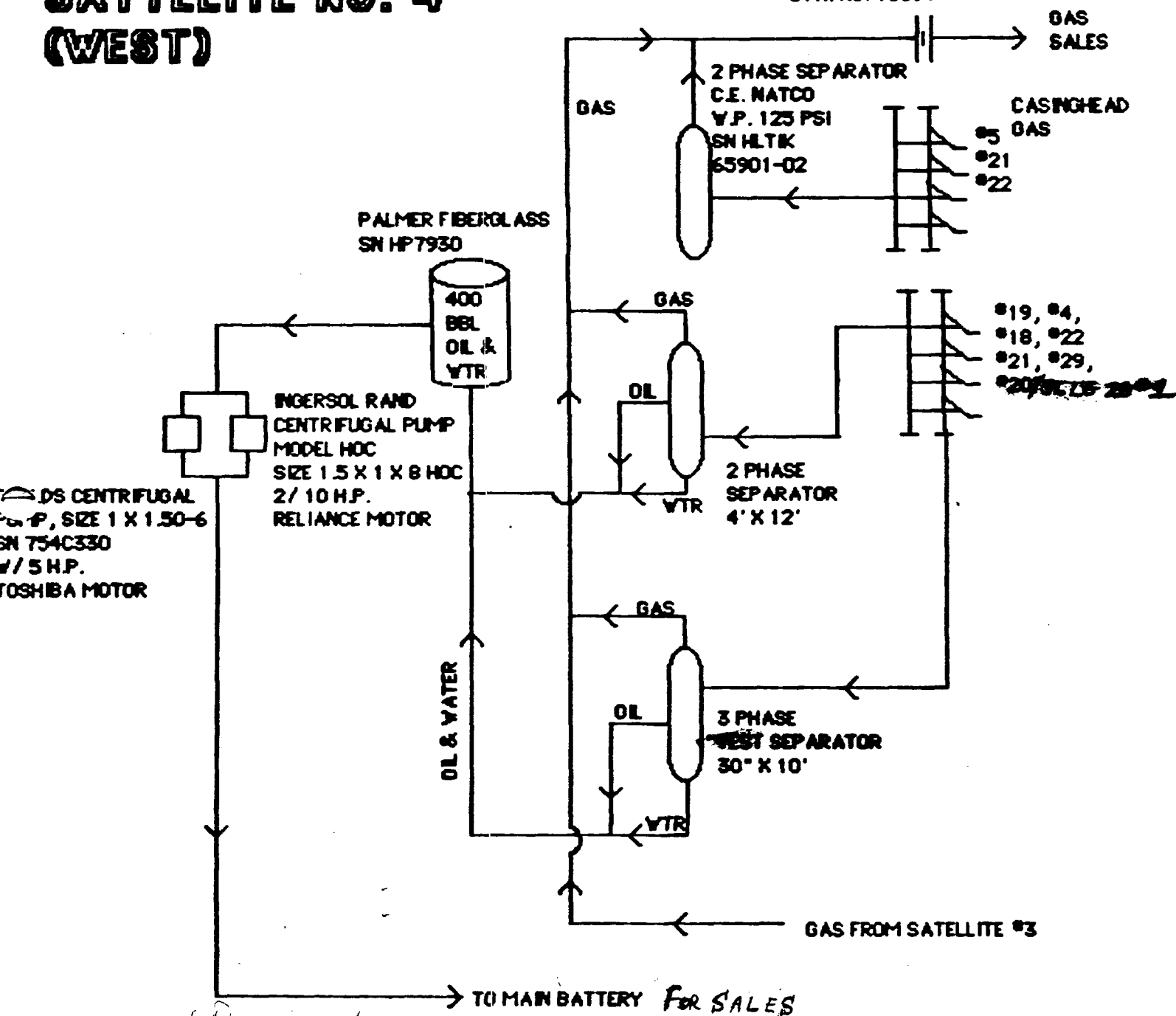

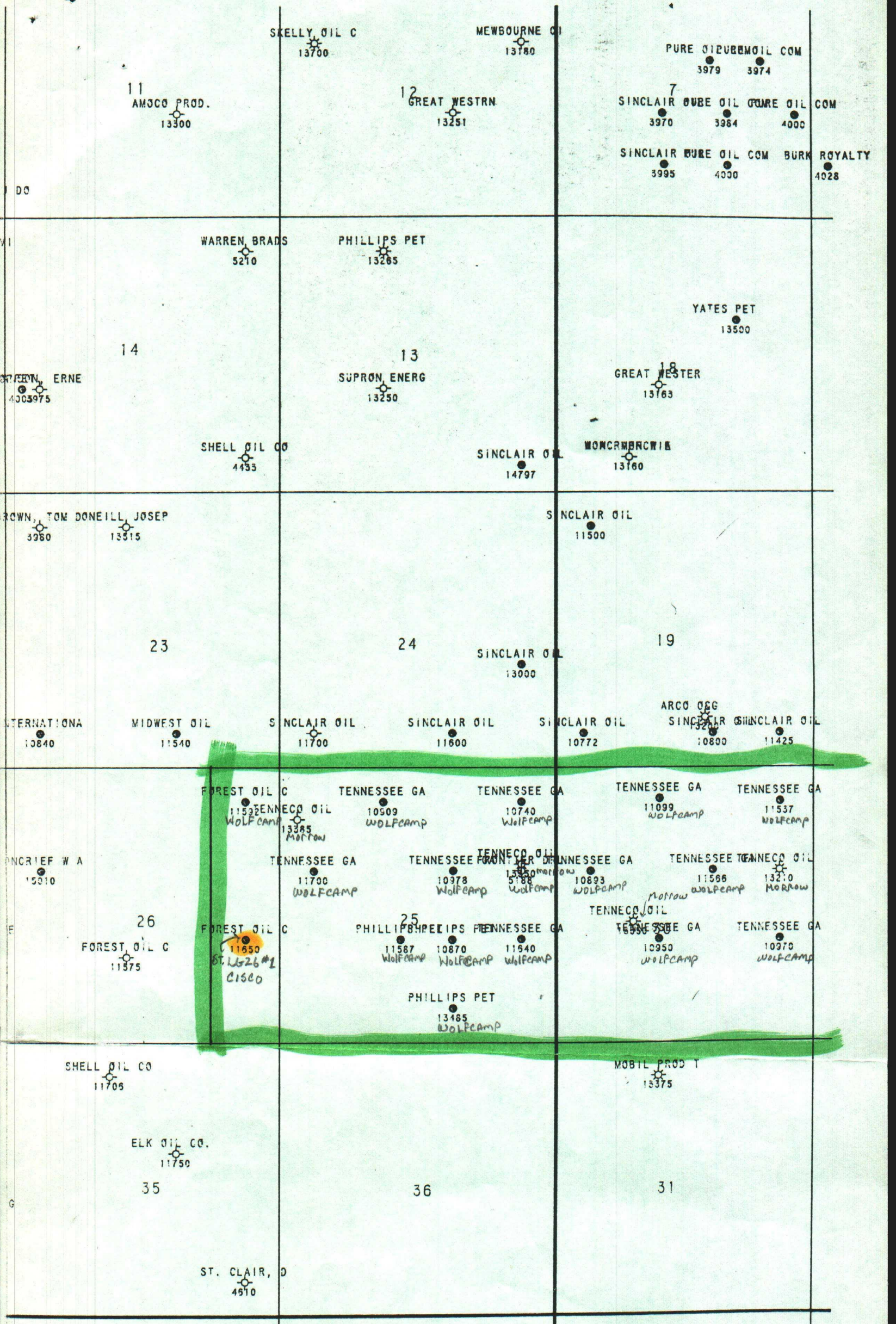
