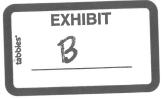

Shelly Albrecht, being duly sworn, deposes and states:

- 1. I am over the age of 18, I am the Director of Land for Franklin Mountain Energy, LLC ("Franklin"), and I have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein. I have previously testified before the Oil Conservation Division ("Division") and I have been qualified by the Division as an expert petroleum landman.
- 2. My area of responsibility at Franklin includes the area of Lea County in New Mexico.
 - 3. I am familiar with the application filed by Franklin in this case.
 - 4. I am familiar with the status of the lands that are subject to the application.
- 5. I submit the following information pursuant to NMAC 19.15.4.12.A(1) in support of the above referenced compulsory pooling application.
- 6. The purpose of the application is to force pool all uncommitted interests into the horizontal spacing unit described below, and in the well to be drilled in the unit.



- 7. No opposition is expected because the interest owners being pooled have been contacted regarding the proposed well, but have failed or refused to voluntarily commit their interests in the well.
- 8. The spacing unit and well that Franklin is proposing in this case is part of a comprehensive development plan, covering the entirety of Sections 1 and 12, and the NW/4 NE/4 and the NE/4 NW/4 of Section 13, Township 26 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. Franklin's development plan includes a total of seven units, including both Wolfcamp and Bone Spring units. The Development Overview is attached as **Exhibit 1.**
- 9. In this case, Franklin seeks an order from the Division pooling all uncommitted mineral interests within a Bone Spring horizontal spacing unit underlying the W/2 E/2 of Sections 1 and 12, and the NW/4 NE/4 of Section 13, Township 26 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- 10. This spacing unit will be dedicated to the **Kaston Fed Com 603H** well, to be horizontally drilled. The Application is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**.
 - 11. Attached as **Exhibit 3** is the proposed C-102 for the well.
- 12. The C-102 identifies the proposed surface hole location, the first take point, and the bottom hole location. The C-102 identifies the pool and pool code.
- 13. The well will develop the WC-025 G-09 S253502B, Lower Bone Spring, Pool Code 98185.
 - 14. This pool is an oil pool with 40-acre building blocks.
- 15. This pool is governed by the state-wide horizontal well rules. The producing interval for the well will be orthodox and will comply with the Division's set back requirements.
 - 16. There are no depth severances within the proposed spacing unit.

- 17. **Exhibit 4** includes a lease tract map outlining the unit being pooled. Exhibit 4 also includes the parties being pooled, the nature, and the percent of their interests.
- 18. I have conducted a diligent search of the public records in the county where the well is located, and conducted phone directory and computer searches to locate contact information for parties entitled to notification, and mailed the working interest owners well proposals, including an Authorization for Expenditure.
- 19. In my opinion, Franklin has made a good faith effort to obtain voluntary joinder of the working interest owners in the proposed well.
 - 20. **Exhibit 5** is a summary of my contacts with the working interest owners.
- 21. **Exhibit 6** is a sample of the well proposal letter that was sent to all working interest owners. The proposal letter identifies the proposed surface hole and bottom hole locations and approximate TVD/MD for the well.
- 22. **Exhibit 7** contains the Authorization for Expenditure for the proposed well. The estimated cost of the well set forth therein is fair and reasonable, and is comparable to the costs of other wells of similar depths and length drilled in this area of New Mexico.
- 23. Franklin requests overhead and administrative rates of \$7000.00/month for drilling a well and \$700.00/month for a producing well. These rates are fair, and comparable to the rates charged by other operators for wells of this type in this area of Southeastern, New Mexico. Franklin requests that these rates be adjusted periodically as provided in the COPAS Accounting Procedure.
- 24. Franklin requests the maximum cost plus 200% risk charge be assessed against non-consenting working interest owners.
 - 25. Franklin requests that it be designated operator of the well.
 - 26. The parties Franklin is seeking to pool were notified of this hearing.

- 27. Franklin seeks to pool overriding royalty interest owners, and they were provided notice of this hearing.
- 28. **Exhibit 8** is an affidavit of notice prepared by counsel for Franklin that shows the parties who were notified of this hearing, the status of whether they received notice, and an affidavit of publication from the Hobbs News-Sun newspaper, showing that notice of this hearing was published on September 15, 2020.
- 29. The attachments to this affidavit were prepared by me, or compiled from company business records, or were prepared at my direction.
- 30. I attest that the information provided herein is correct and complete to the best of my knowledge and belief.
- 31. In my opinion, the granting of this application is in the interests of conservation and the prevention of waste.

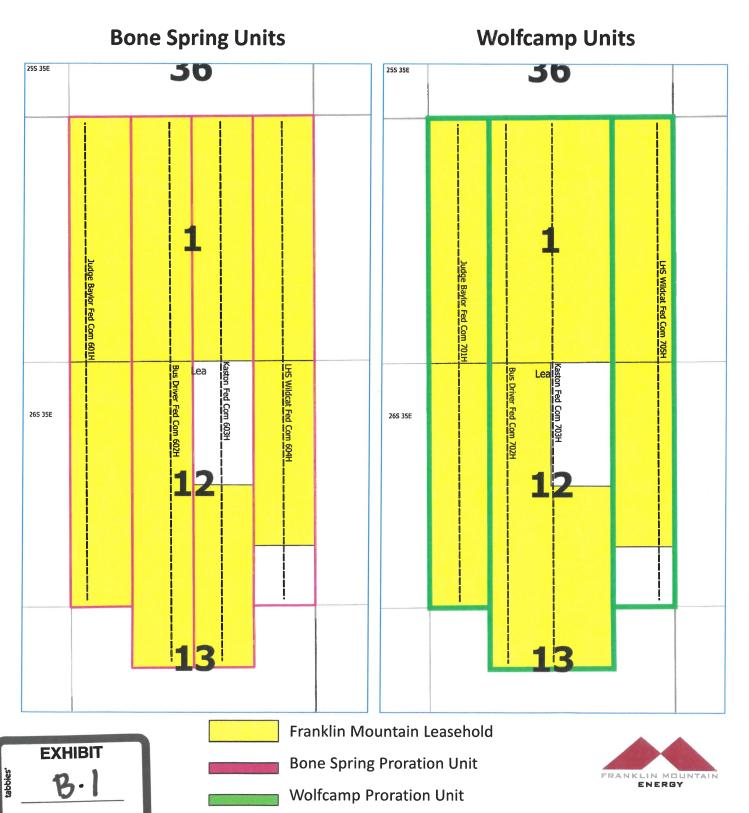

Franklin Mountain Energy, LLC ("FME"), OGRID Number 373910, through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes an application to the Oil Conservation Division ("Division") pursuant to the provisions of NMSA (1978), Section 70-2-17, for an order pooling all uncommitted mineral interests within a Bone Spring horizontal spacing unit underlying the W/2 E/2 of Sections 1 and 12, and the NW/4 NE/4 of Section 13, Township 26 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico

In support of this application, FME states as follows:

- 1. FME has an interest in the subject lands and has a right to drill and operate a well thereon.
- 2. FME seeks to dedicate the W/2 E/2 of Sections 1 and 12, and the NW/4 NE/4 of Section 13, Township 26 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico to form a 360-acre, more or less, spacing unit.
- 3. FME plans to drill the **Kaston Fed Com 603H** well to a depth sufficient to test the Bone Spring formation. The well will be horizontally drilled and will be drilled at orthodox locations under the Division's rules.

- 4. FME sought, but has been unable to obtain, a voluntary agreement from all interest owners in the Bone Spring formation underlying the proposed spacing unit to participate in the drilling of the well or to otherwise commit their interests to the well.
- 5. The pooling of all interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying the proposed unit will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells, prevent waste and protect correlative rights.
- 6. FME further requests that it be allowed one (1) year between the time the well is drilled and completion of the well under the order issued by the Division.

WHEREFORE, FME requests this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on October 8, 2020, and after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order:

- A. Pooling all mineral interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying a horizontal spacing unit within the W/2 E/2 of Sections 1 and 12, and the NW/4 NE/4 of Section 13, Township 26 South, Range 35 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico;
 - B. Designating FME as operator of this unit and the well to be drilled thereon;
- C. Authorizing FME to recover its costs of drilling, equipping and completing the well;
- D. Approving actual operating charges and costs charged for supervision, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedure;
- E. Setting a 200% charge for the risk involved in drilling and completing the well in the event a working interest owner elects not to participate in the well;
- F. Allowing a time period of one (1) year between when the well is drilled and completion of the well under the order issued by the Division.

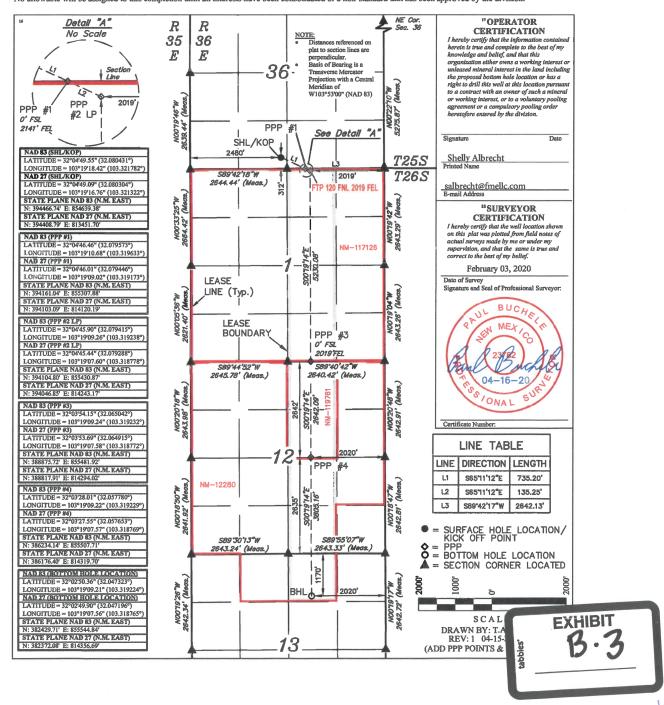
WELL LOCATION AND ACREAGE DEDICATION PLAT

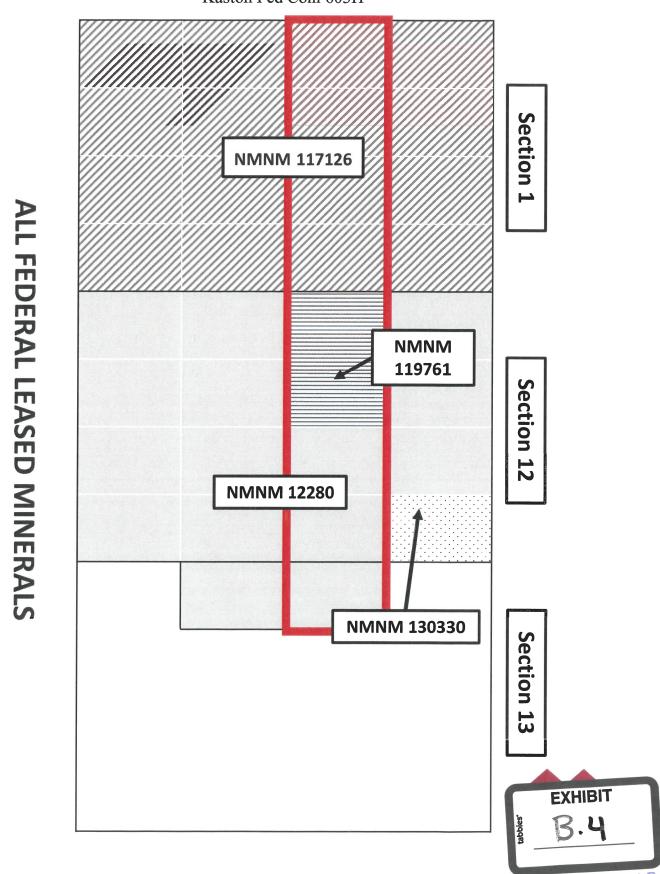

W2E2 of Sections 1 & 12; NWNE of Section 13-T26S-T35E – 360 Gross Acres Kaston Fed Com 603H

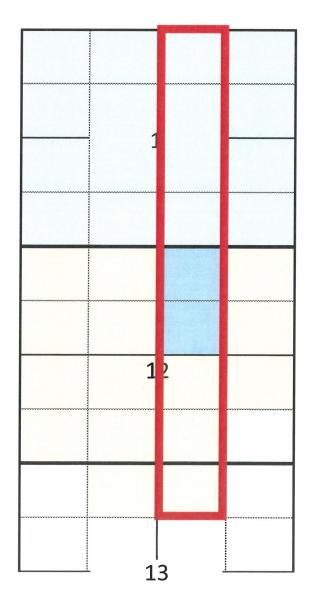

Ben Kessel, being duly sworn, deposes and states:

- 1. I am over the age of 18, I am a geologist for Franklin Mountain Energy, LLC ("Franklin"), and have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein. I have previously testified before the Oil Conservation Division ("Division") and my credentials as an expert petroleum geologist were accepted by the Division as a matter of record.
- 2. My area of responsibility at Franklin includes the area of Lea County in New Mexico.
 - 3. I am familiar with the application filed by Franklin in this case.
- 4. **Exhibit 9** is a locator map showing the approximate location of the proposed unit in relation to the Capitan Reef.
- 5. **Exhibit 10** is a wellbore schematic showing Franklin's development plan, which includes the well at issue in this case and the wells proposed in Case Numbers 21438-21441 and 21443-21444.

- 6. The exhibits behind **Tab 11** is the geology study I prepared for the **Kaston Fed Com 603H** well.
- 7. **Exhibit 11-A** is structure map of top of the Third Bone Spring Sand. The proposed project area is identified by a pink box. The Kaston Fed Com 603H well is the pink dashed line identified by the box labeled "1". The contour interval used this exhibit is 25 feet. This exhibit shows that the structure dips gently to the south.
- 8. **Exhibit 11-B** identifies five wells in the vicinity of the proposed well, shown by a line of cross-section running from A to A'.
- 9. **Exhibit 11-C** is a stratigraphic cross section hung on the Wolfcamp top. The well logs on the cross-section give a representative sample of the Third Bone Spring Sand formation in the area. The target zone is identified by the words "Producing Zone" and the shaded area across the cross section. I have also identified where the Kaston Fed Com 603H well falls within the wells I used for the cross-section.
 - 10. In my opinion, the gross interval thickness thickens slightly from north to the south.
- 11. **Exhibit 11-D** is a Gross Interval Isochore of the Third Bone Spring Sand. The gross interval thickness thickens slightly from north to the south.
 - 12. I conclude from the maps that:
 - a. The horizontal spacing unit is justified from a geologic standpoint.
 - b. There are no structural impediments or faulting that will interfere with horizontal development.
 - c. Each quarter quarter section in the proposed unit will contribute more or less equally to production.

- 13. **Exhibit 12** provides an overview of the stress orientation in the area based on the 2018 Snee-Zoback paper.
- $14. \hspace{1.5cm} \text{The preferred well orientation in this area is either north/south or south/north.}$ This is because the S_{Hmax} is at approximately 265 degrees in this area of Lea County.
- 15. Exhibits 9-12 were prepared by me or under my supervision or compiled from company business records.
- 16. In my opinion, the granting of Franklin's application is in the interests of conservation and the prevention of waste.

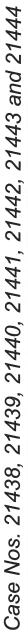

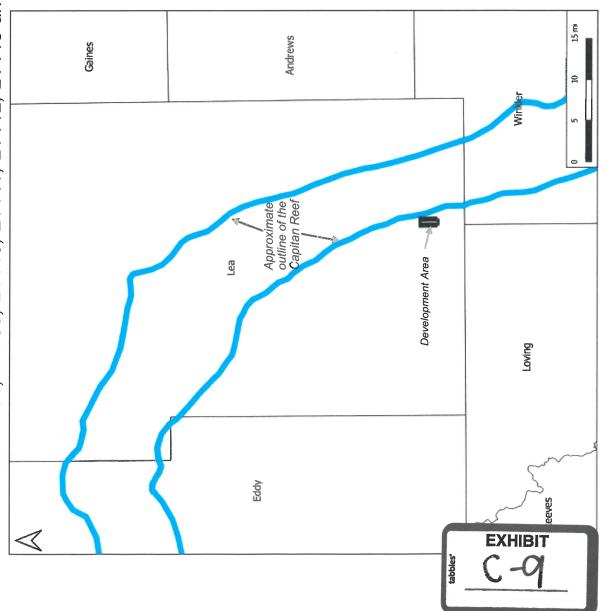

- Planned wells are located outside of the western edge of the Capitan Reef

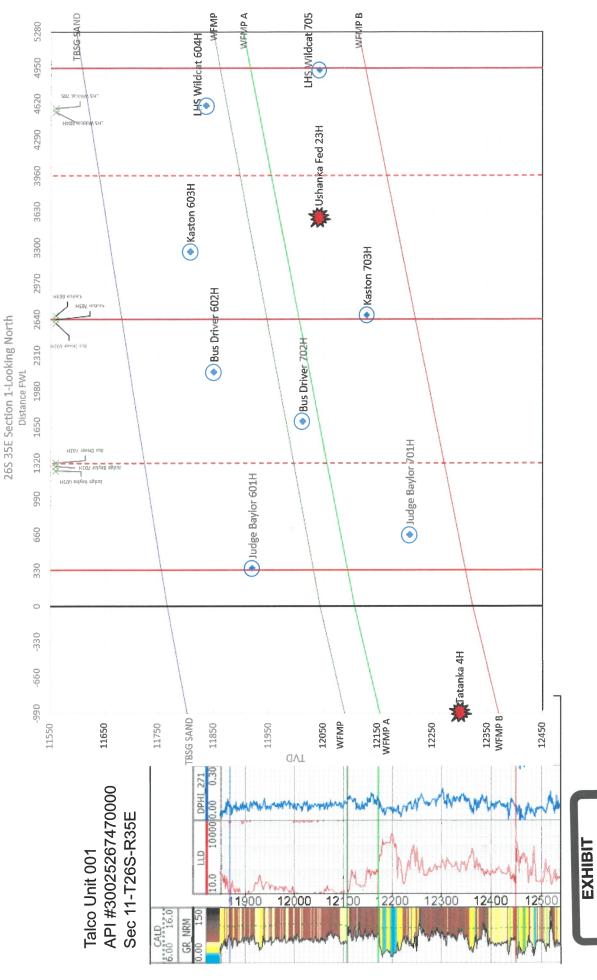

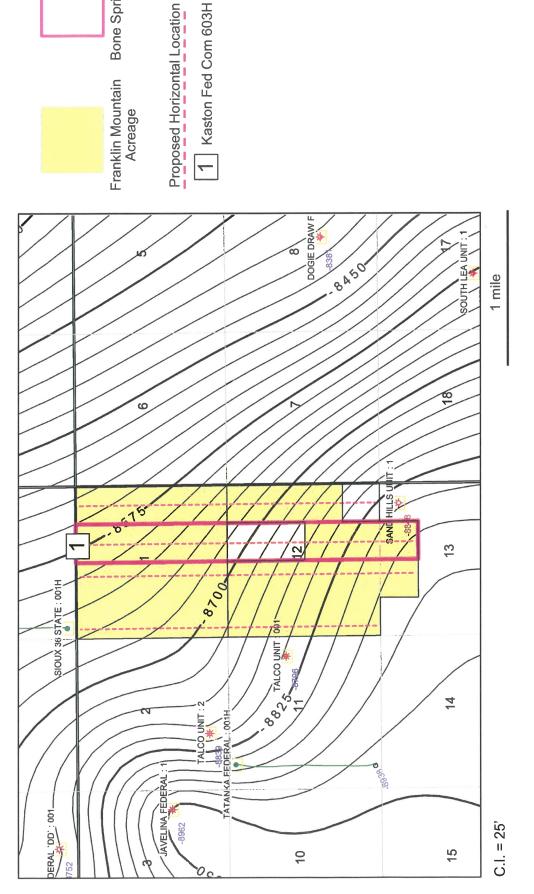


Third Bone Spring Structure Map (SSTVD)

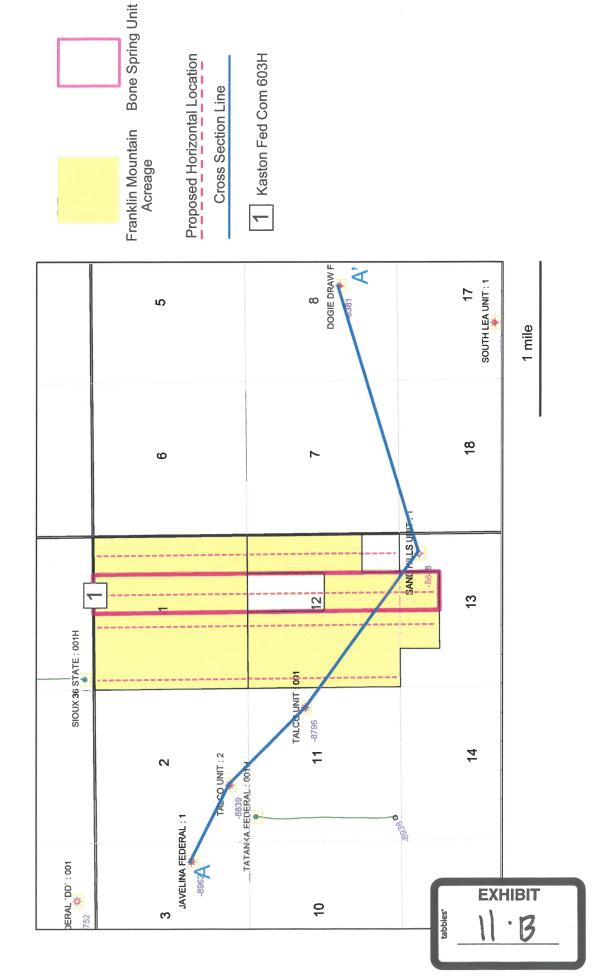




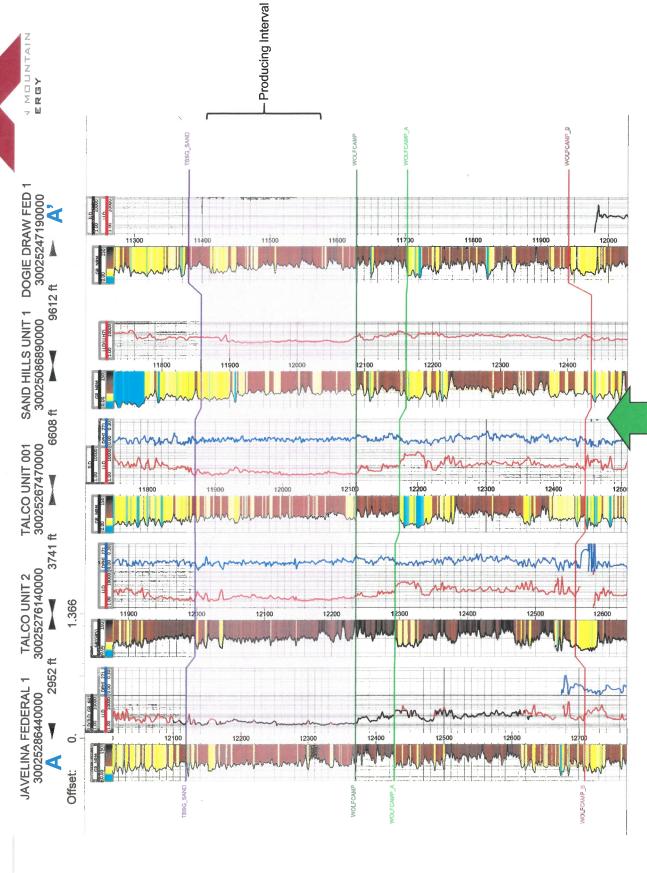
Third Bone Spring Cross Section Reference Map

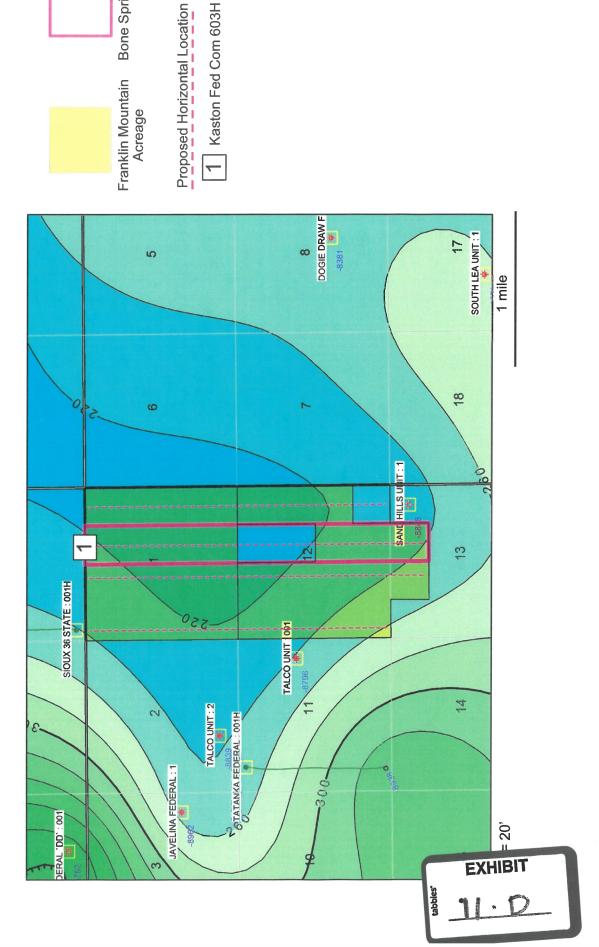


Third Bone Spring Sand Isochore Map

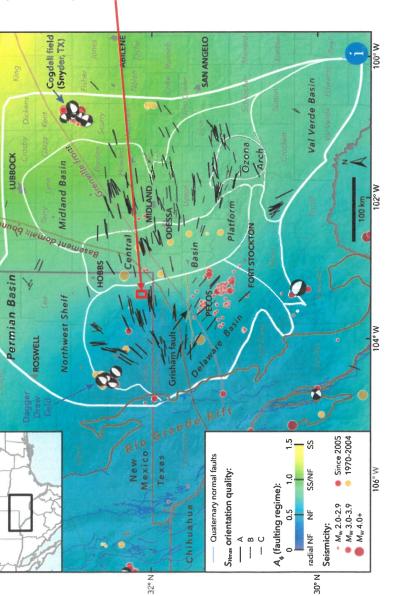


Regional Stress
