ORDER OF DISMISSAL

These cases were consolidated and continued indefinitely on June 18, 1998, at the request of the applicants. Pursuant to an Order to Show Cause issued on September 29, 2010, these cases came before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on November 4, 2010, in order for the applicants and all interested parties to appear and show cause why the cases should not be dismissed given the lengthy time period that they have been pending before the Commission. An appearance was made by Scott Hall for Energen Resources Corporation, the successor in interest to Gillespie-Crow, Inc. Mr. Hall explained that the subject matter of these cases had been resolved by the entry of Oil Conservation Division Order No. R-10864-B on March 20, 2000, and that there was no objection to the dismissal of these cases. No other appearances were entered at the November 4, 2010 hearing, and no objections were raised in the dismissal of these cases. Now therefore, the Commission Chair,


FINDS THAT:
