The subject wells should be plugged as outlined below:

Williams & Gore Well No. 1-A, NE/4 NW/4, Section 27, Township 7 North, Range 4 West, Valencia County, New Mexico.

This well should be cleaned out to a depth of 3705 feet and filled with heavy plugging mud. A 25-sack cement plug should be spotted at a depth of 250 feet by means of tubing, and a 10-sack cement plug should be set at the surface. A steel pipe four inches in diameter should be set as a marker in the top of the cement and should extend four feet above the surface of the terrain.

Hawaiian-New Mexico Oil Ventures Well No. 1, SW/4 SW/4, Section 27, Township 7 North, Range 4 West, Valencia County, New Mexico.

This well should be cleaned out to a depth of 3604 feet and filled completely from total depth to the surface with cement. A steel pipe
