Gentlemen :-

I enclose forms filled out showing completion of the Tex-Mex No 1 Carbon Dioxide or CO₂ well in section 2, township 26 range 24 on the Tex-Mex Cattle Co., lease.

Bottom hole test 1520 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' plugged up from bottom to about 1515' or bottom of gas sand with lead wool tamped thoroughly down solid with machine tool.

Set 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' casing at 1499 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' cemented up on outside several feet from bottom with a complete moisture shut off at bottom of casing, this leaves open hole from 1499 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' to about 1515' or about 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ '.

On account of inaccurate line measurement when the gas first blew in when drilling our producing sand is between 1512' and 1515'.

Not having a true pressure gauge or instrument to measure the volume I would say they are about the same as taken last march by L.O. Warner who is the engineer for the Witt Ice Company of Estancia, at that time we had a volume of 300,000 cu ft. 99.8 purity.

We will appreciate you sending your inspector up as soon as convenient as we have some tools rented and the owners of machine want to move off. We have tried and believe we have finished the well in good condition and according to State regulations.
