With reference to your letter to Trans Pecos Resources, Inc. dated December 27, 1985, and our subsequent discussions related thereto, this is to confirm that the leaking wellhead (master valve) on the Latigo Ranch #C-1 well has been repaired. On January 20-21, 1986, the well was blown down and killed with fresh water, and the faulty master valve was removed and replaced with a good valve. The well is presently loaded with water and shut-in.

In the near future, Trans Pecos also plans to plug and abandon the Latigo Ranch #A-1, #B-2, #C-1 and #D-1 wells, and to clean up and restore their locations. At the same time, the locations of the #1 Simpson well and the undrilled Latigo Ranch #A-2 and #B-1 wells will also be restored. An AFE is being prepared for approval by the working interest owners, and following their approvals, formal notice of intention to plug and abandon will be filed. We will keep you advised of the work schedule.
