Dear Mr. Ulvog:

I have your letter of December 2, 1975, regarding the above-captioned wells.

At the time of plugging these wells, I was assured by officials of Olympic Corporation that proper procedure would be and was used in the plugging of these wells in accordance with the plugging rules of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission. I was told that the location was cleared, they had paid a man to fill the pits and level the location.

Astro-Tex Oil Company did not have any interest in these wells. Olympic Petroleum Corporation was obligated to drill this well and did not have a bond. It was agreed that they would drill the well under Astro-Tex provided they abide by every rule of drilling, completion, and/or plugging and abandoning the well.

All information on form C 103 that was mailed to the Oil Conservation Commission was furnished to Astro-Tex Oil Corporation by the Olympic Oil Corporation and was represented as being true and correct.

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Since receiving your letter of December 2, 1975, I have talked to Mr. Cook on Friday of last week, who was president of Olympic Oil Corporation. He again said a man was paid to clean and clear location. However, the superintendent that paid the man was no longer with Olympic. He said he had his phone number and would call him, and find out who the man or company was that he paid for clearing the location.

I will be in Dallas soon, and will visit the office of Olympic Petroleum Corporation and see if I can obtain more and better information concerning the plugging of above captioned wells.

We certainly want to furnish the Oil Conservation Commission proper information and clear the location of the above-captioned wells as it should be.
