This will acknowledge your letter of February 17, 1976, concerning the Olympic Wells #1 and #1-A in Harding County, New Mexico.

Before the abandonment of these locations can be approved, it will be necessary for all of the trash which resulted from the drilling operations to be removed and the ground leveled or returned to its original configuration. The pits and ruts will need to be filled, obviously. It is permissible to dispose of the waste materials and trash by placing in the pits prior to filling them.

Please advise when the clean-up work has been completed.
