Please be advised that the above captioned well is not plugged and abandoned as perhaps you may have been led to believe.

I inspected the Timmons wells and plant last week and found that the #1 Timmons well is presently producing carbon dioxide gas for bottle gas sale, which sale is made to various users in Tucumcari, Dalhart and other Texas towns in that vicinity. This well has a surface pressure of approximately fifteen pounds. The production is not being metered at the well and gas is gathered in a storage tank at the plant and then compressed to facilitate bottling. The plant is now operating in this manner at the rate of eight hours per day and employs only one man.

The plugging bond covering this well definitely needs to continue in force as long as the well remains unplugged.
