Dear Mr. Chavez:

In answer to your letter of June 9, 1954, I am sorry if we failed to give you all the information you required.

I am enclosing copies of the drilling log of the cable tool rig which shows a T.D. of 1980'. I am certain we gave you cutting's samples to that depth as we had concluded drilling and placed the charge of dynamite in the hole before you left the location. You probably recall that you furnished us sample sacks at which time we divided our samples with you from 1915' to 1980'. The samples from 0-1915' were in the envelopes which we also gave you at the same time.

The well has not been connected to the extraction plant but you may be assured we will use an individual well metering device. At the present time the gauge on the well is at 625 lbs pressure p.s.i.

We shot the formation with 50 lbs. dynamite at 9 p.m. on 6-2-54 and after considerable swabbing the gauge on the well stood at about 300 p.s.i. The charge was placed between 1870' and 1890'.

I don't believe you should have any further worry with Mr. Timmons' wells as he will be unable to use them when he converts to our high pressure gas which should be done in the very near future. At that time we hope to either deepen his wells or make oil wells from them.
