- 2 EXAMINER JONES: Good morning, everyone.
- 3 This is the examiner hearing for April the 18th. This
- 4 is Docket Number 14-19. Already the end of the first
- 5 quarter is here and time for the reports to EPA for all
- 6 of us.
- 7 We wanted to make sure we introduced Velvet
- 8 Valentine.
- 9 Velvet, will you stand up?
- 10 She is our point of contact now with the
- 11 office here in Santa Fe. And so there is a sign-in
- 12 sheet when you come in to -- right next to her. She's
- 13 very efficient. She's got up calendars, and we tell her
- 14 when we're going to be absent, and she knows everything.
- 15 And she's got -- if you call the main number, she gets
- 16 the main number. It's going to be Velvet,
- 17 Florene and -- who else now is going to get it?
- MS. MURPHY: Marlene.
- 19 EXAMINER JONES: -- Marlene. Okay.
- 20 And so Velvet is going to be our person to
- 21 make appointments to come in and talk and make sure
- 22 we're there. It's better if you know we're there before
- 23 you come in.
- Now, Marlene --
- 25 Marlene, do you want to come up and sit?

1 Marlene is pretty much taking over --

- 2 taking care of our examiner dockets, and we wanted to
- 3 make sure that everyone knows that. We've got the OCD
- 4 hearing email now and the OCC hearing email. So those
- 5 should always be copied every time you have
- 6 correspondence related to a case. And Marlene takes
- 7 care of that email, and she takes care of all our files
- 8 and basically been a great help to Florene. She's
- 9 coming back after being down in Forestry for a while.
- 10 So we're glad to have her back.
- 11 Okay. So we've got a handout back in the
- 12 back. I don't know if everybody got my email last night
- 13 about the current record of what's on the docket right
- 14 now. I don't know if the handout is still back there,
- 15 but if you don't have one, please pick it up and follow
- 16 along with me, if you will, and then -- and then tell me
- 17 your corrections after -- after I dismiss all of
- 18 Mr. Bruce's cases here.
- 19 Okay. Page 1, I've got a record that Case
- 20 20267 is continued. And Cases 16239, 16240, 16241,
- 21 16242, 16243 -- these are all EOG cases -- they're all
- 22 dismissed.
- 23 Down to number 23 on the docket, which is
- 24 Cases 20291, 20292, 20293, 20210, 20211, 20255, 16381,
- 25 20169, 20164, 20163, those are all -- I have a record of

- 1 those being continued.
- 2 Before I move on, we have the Lime Rock
- 3 cases, 20210 and 20211, as continued to May 30th. It
- 4 will be Mr. Larson -- or Mr. Bruce.
- Is that correct?
- 6 MR. BRUCE: My two cases?
- 7 EXAMINER JONES: Your two cases. They
- 8 would be in conjunction with the other contested
- 9 matters.
- MR. BRUCE: Percussion cases.
- MR. RANKIN: Correct.
- 12 EXAMINER JONES: Percussion cases.
- Okay. Continuing on with the docket:
- 14 20136, continued; 20138, continued; 20317, continued;
- 15 20135, continued. And then the Matador cases, 16470,
- 16 16471, 16472, 16473, 16474, 16475, are continued. And
- 17 Cases 20246, 20247, 20265, continued. And then
- 18 Mewbourne cases, 20053, 20054, are continued. Okay.
- 19 Number 51 on the docket, Cases 20175,
- 20 20176, 20177, 20178, 20173, 20180, those are all Novo
- 21 cases. They're continued.
- 22 And the Percussion case, 20226, continued.
- 23 The two Tap Rock -- the first two Tap Rock cases, 20118,
- 24 20119, dismissed. And there are four Tap Rock cases
- 25 now, 16467, 16430, 16431, 16489, continued.

1 The NGL cases, 16504, 16506 and 20150 are

- 2 being readvertised, and they're set for May the 2nd.
- 3 And Cases 16507, 20141, 20151, 20142 are all continued,
- 4 all those NGL cases.
- 5 And the two Rover cases, 16354 and 16355,
- 6 are continued.
- 7 Of the two Novo cases, numbers 76 and 77,
- 8 which is 16344, 16345, are dismissed.
- 9 The two EOG cases, 16221, 16434, continued.
- And two Mewbourne cases, 16184, 20248, are
- 11 continued.
- 12 And Percussion Case 20190 is continued.
- 13 And the Cimarex cases, 20301 through 20308,
- 14 are continued to June 20th, along with Cases 20162,
- 15 20260, 20259. Those are all continued to June 20th.
- 16 Marathon cases, 20309, 20310, 20219, 20217,
- 17 20218, are continued. The three XTO cases, 20276, 77,
- 18 and 78, are continued.
- 19 Two Cimarex cases, 20283, 20284, are
- 20 continued.
- 21 And the Blackbuck case, Case 20315, is
- 22 continued to May 30th and will be heard in conjunction
- 23 with the Mesquite matter. And 20316 is dismissed.
- 24 Any changes to the docket?
- MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, on page 1, cases

one and two, 16409 and 16410, Ascent, those cases should

- 2 be dismissed.
- 3 EXAMINER JONES: Thanks, Jim.
- 4 MR. BRUCE: And then on page 3, the Novo
- 5 cases, in the middle of the page -- there's six of
- 6 them -- five of them, whatever -- they were continued
- 7 to -- I requested May 16th, but Mr. DeBrine isn't
- 8 available then and so he's asked that they be continued
- 9 to May 30th.
- 10 And, Mike, were you interested in those?
- MR. FELDEWERT: Yes.
- MR. BRUCE: Do you have an objection to May
- 13 30th?
- MR. FELDEWERT: No.
- 15 MR. LARSON: And I represent WPG [sic]
- 16 Exploration, and I don't object.
- 17 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. Will those be a
- 18 contested matter?
- 19 MR. BRUCE: I don't know. The parties are
- 20 discussing amongst themselves. There are three players,
- 21 I think, COG and Chevron and Novo. So this gives them
- 22 extra time.
- 23 EXAMINER JONES: Okay.
- 24 MR. BRUCE: Right above that, it says --
- 25 Mewbourne Oil Company is the next case. That was the

- one that was filed by Tom Ragsdale contesting well
- 2 costs. I just bring it up because I don't believe he's
- 3 here. So the Division can do what it wants with the
- 4 case.
- 5 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. Subject to
- 6 Mr. Bruce's -- Mr. Brooks' guidance here, I think we're
- 7 going to dismiss that case.
- 8 EXAMINER BROOKS: Sounds like a good idea.
- 9 EXAMINER JONES: If it needs to be
- 10 refiled --
- MR. BRUCE: And then the one final thing is
- on page 2, the last three Kaiser-Francis cases, 20291, 2
- 13 and 3. With Mr. Feldewert's permission -- I do plan on
- 14 putting them on, but I would ask they be moved to the
- 15 end of the docket, as well as the other Kaiser-Francis
- 16 cases.
- 17 MR. FELDEWERT: That's fine.
- 18 EXAMINER JONES: That's acceptable?
- 19 Okay. Any other changes?
- 20 Any other pleas for a certain continuance
- 21 date also?
- 22 MR. DeBRINE: Yeah. While we're on page 2,
- 23 Mr. Bruce neglected to mention the Matador cases, which
- 24 are set -- which were continued to May 16th, but it's
- 25 the same issue, that they should be continued to May

- 1 30th when we're available.
- 2 EXAMINER ONES: Okay. There are a whole
- 3 bunch of Matador -- you're talking about the
- 4 Leatherneck?
- 5 MR. DeBRINE: Numbers 45, 46 and 47, the
- 6 Ray State.
- 7 EXAMINER JONES: The Ray State.
- 8 MR. DeBRINE: 20246.
- 9 EXAMINER JONES: And 20265, too, right?
- 10 MR. DeBRINE: Right, the two Ray States.
- 11 EXAMINER JONES: To May 30th?
- MR. DeBRINE: May 30th.
- 13 And also on page 1, the third case for
- 14 Cimarex, 20254, should be continued to May 30th as well.
- 15 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. I'm having a little
- 16 troubling finding that one.
- 17 20254, continued?
- 18 MR. DeBRINE: Yeah, continued to May 30th.
- 19 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. That's number three
- 20 on the docket.
- MR. DeBRINE: Correct.
- 22 EXAMINER JONES: As we have been doing the
- 23 last few hearings --
- MR. LARSON: Mr. Examiner, I have one more.
- 25 EXAMINER JONES: Yes, sir.

1 MR. LARSON: Gary Larson for Seguro Oil and

- 2 Gas, case number 73, 20253. I requested that be
- 3 continued to May 16th.
- 4 EXAMINER JONES: You need it on May 16th?
- 5 MR. LARSON: (Indicating.)
- I emailed a request.
- 7 EXAMINER JONES: Sharon.
- 8 MS. SHAHEEN: Case Number 20190, 82 on the
- 9 docket, the Percussion Lakewood Federal #20H. You'll
- 10 notice there is a competing case, 20248, that Mr. Bruce
- 11 has, and it notes that there was a special docket
- 12 requested. So I just wanted to clarify whether you
- 13 wanted us to go forward on May 16th or you wanted us to
- 14 set a special docket date.
- 15 EXAMINER JONES: Who is 20190 and 20248?
- 16 MS. SHAHEEN: 20190 is Percussion and 20248
- 17 Mewbourne. Is that right?
- MR. BRUCE: Yes.
- 19 EXAMINER JONES: Oh, yeah, yeah. I'm
- 20 sorry.
- 21 Both of these cases are competing. How
- 22 long will they take?
- MR. BRUCE: I don't think it's a whole day.
- 24 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. Okay. Thanks, Jim
- 25 (laughter). Not a whole day, huh?

1 MR. BRUCE: You know -- you know, two to

- 2 three hours. I mean, it's a case where I do not plan on
- 3 presenting any engineering. It would be a landman and a
- 4 geologist. I think it's fairly straightforward.
- MS. SHAHEEN: We'll have all three, a
- 6 landman, geologist and engineer.
- 7 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. Sounds like half a
- 8 day then.
- 9 EXAMINER WARNELL: Why can't we do it on
- 10 the 16th?
- MS. SHAHEEN: We can. There was the note
- 12 about the special docket, so I wanted to make sure that
- 13 you weren't expecting a special docket date.
- 14 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. So tell your
- 15 witnesses it may be on the 17th, depending on the load.
- 16 But for scheduling purposes, for the 16th.
- MS. SHAHEEN: Okay.
- MR. BRUCE: Okay.
- 19 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. Any other changes,
- 20 comments?
- MR. FELDEWERT: A comment, question.
- 22 EXAMINER JONES: Yes, sir.
- MR. FELDEWERT: The May 30th docket, which
- 24 would be the third docket in May, is that going to be a
- 25 hybrid docket where we can have new cases, as well as

- 1 continued cases?
- 2 EXAMINER JONES: The word I got is it's
- 3 just continued cases. That's what -- Florene was asking
- 4 that early on, and that's -- unless -- unless something
- 5 changes on that. You know, we're using that for
- 6 continued cases. But let's see here. So far -- so far
- 7 my list only has four cases on that day other than the
- 8 ones we are doing from this docket.
- 9 MR. FELDEWERT: Right. So is it possible
- 10 we could consider making that like a hybrid docket?
- 11 EXAMINER JONES: It's possible. Florene
- 12 would have to -- you'd have to get the stuff in 30 days
- 13 before that --
- MR. FELDEWERT: Yes.
- 15 EXAMINER JONES: -- of course, and she'd
- 16 have to publish a notice.
- 17 Marlene, this is your bailiwick. What do
- 18 you think?
- 19 MS. SALVIDREZ: What do I think? I would
- 20 say no, but that's just me.
- 21 (Laughter.)
- 22 MR. FELDEWERT: Wait a minute. Let's talk
- 23 about that.
- 24 (Laughter.)
- MS. SALVIDREZ: It's up to you guys.

1 MR. FELDEWERT: Because the problem we have

- 2 is it's more than a month before we have a new case
- docket, and, of course, filings would be due at the end
- 4 of month. But if there is any possibility of making
- 5 that more of a hybrid docket, where we could have some
- 6 new cases, that would be helpful to a lot of people.
- 7 EXAMINER JONES: Well, it's possible that
- 8 docket won't be very full.
- 9 EXAMINER WARNELL: We can run it by the
- 10 folks upstairs, but I tend to agree with Marlene, the
- 11 answer is no. But we'll run it by the folks upstairs
- 12 and see what we can do.
- 13 EXAMINER BROOKS: Remember the Capital One
- 14 commercials. The answer is always no.
- 15 EXAMINER JONES: Well, we'll talk about it
- 16 upstairs --
- MR. FELDEWERT: Okay. Thank you.
- 18 EXAMINER JONES: -- with Florene and Gabe.
- 19 As far as this -- we're rapidly moving
- 20 towards maybe having our new database print these
- 21 dockets out, so we're trying to get all our data entered
- 22 and get the report out. So that's coming. In the
- 23 meantime, if -- I had a nightmare trying to get all my
- 24 cases ready for today because Scott got pulled into some
- 25 other meeting, and so it really helps to be able to sort

1 this. And I've been sending it out to you folks in PDF

- 2 format, and I'm thinking you probably want an Excel
- 3 format so you can sort it a little bit. So if you do,
- 4 let me know. I can just send it that way.
- 5 And we had discussed talking about -- so,
- 6 Earl and Jim, can get together with Terry by phone,
- 7 maybe, about setting the Apache, Ascent issue.
- 8 MR. DeBRINE: Okay. We can do that.
- 9 EXAMINER JONES: Okay.
- 10 Okay. If anybody is -- looks like we'll
- 11 just move right on down the docket and -- it's too early
- 12 to take a break.
- Mr. Bruce, do you want to start first?
- 14 We've got yours scheduled, the Cimarex cases.
- 15 MR. BRUCE: Oh. Those were also continued
- 16 at somebody else's request, and I don't object.
- 17 EXAMINER JONES: Number four and five?
- 18 MR. BRUCE: Number four and five, those
- 19 should be continued to May 16th.
- 20 EXAMINER JONES: Is it all right if we go
- 21 to May 30th on those?
- MR. BRUCE: Sure. Sure.
- MS. BENNETT: Actually, that was Jennifer
- 24 Bradfute with Marathon.
- 25 MR. BRUCE: Yeah. It's Marathon.

- 1 May 30th is all right with me.
- 2 EXAMINER WARNELL: We have a little bit of
- 3 issue with the docket on May 16th, you know, because it
- 4 may carry over to May 17th. They've rescheduled the OCC
- 5 hearing to May 17th.
- 6 MR. FELDEWERT: Why did they do that?
- 7 (Laughter.)
- 8 EXAMINER WARNELL: I don't know. They
- 9 didn't ask me.
- So, you know, I'm not quite sure how we're
- 11 going to handle that. Perhaps we can do everything for
- the OCD hearings on the 16th, and Maureen, on the 17th,
- 13 could have OCC later in the day.
- 14 MR. FELDEWERT: Does that OCC docket have
- 15 cases on it?
- 16 EXAMINER WARNELL: I believe it does,
- 17 but --
- MR. FELDEWERT: Because the last two have
- 19 been very short.
- 20 EXAMINER WARNELL: The last two have been
- 21 extremely short. This could be a little longer.
- 22 MS. BENNETT: On the scheduling for the
- 23 16th and 17th, we also have a special hearing date set
- 24 for May 17 for the Homework Larry, Duda Bides, Little
- 25 Giant, Little Rascals, and I think Mike might have some

1 cases for that hearing date, too. So that's been set

- 2 for May 17th, just as a reminder.
- 3 EXAMINER JONES: So there might be some
- 4 issues with it -- with that date?
- 5 MS. BENNETT: Well, I'm just saying that
- 6 it's already booked, so to the extent that there is
- 7 discussion about having other things on the 17th, like
- 8 moving cases over from the 16th --
- 9 EXAMINER JONES: Oh, yeah, yeah.
- 10 MS. BENNETT: -- there is already a full
- 11 day set aside for this special hearing date for those --
- 12 all of those cases.
- MR. FELDEWERT: Right. They're saying
- 14 there is a Commission hearing.
- MS. BENNETT: Right. Yes. There's that,
- 16 too, so just as a heads-up.
- 17 EXAMINER JONES: Terry, is that true?
- 18 We've got a Commission date the same day?
- 19 EXAMINER WARNELL: Yeah. There is a
- 20 Commission date on the 17th.
- 21 EXAMINER JONES: Well, we've got May 30th
- 22 available.
- 23 EXAMINER BROOKS: There is a rumor that the
- 24 Hilcorp cases have been settled. Is that true?
- MR. FELDEWERT: Completely settled? It

- 1 depends on what the Division's position is.
- 2 EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay. And this is one of
- 3 those situations where I've been asked to file papers
- 4 and things, but I've not been told what's going on.
- 5 MR. FELDEWERT: And that's made it
- 6 difficult for this to get resolved.
- 7 EXAMINER BROOKS: It makes it difficult for
- 8 everyone.
- 9 MR. FELDEWERT: So whatever clarification
- 10 you can provide there at some point will be helpful.
- 11 EXAMINER BROOKS: Well, if I can catch the
- 12 boss at some point, I will ask her.
- 13 EXAMINER JONES: We have one SWD case on
- 14 the docket, I believe, Solaris. And Mr. Bruce is
- 15 putting that case on. I don't know how many people are
- 16 here for that, but we hope to just start that right
- 17 after lunch.
- MR. BRUCE: Which case?
- 19 MR. GOETZE: Solaris. Does that work for
- 20 you?
- MR. BRUCE: Everything works for me.
- 22 EXAMINER JONES: Which would be 1:30, just
- 23 for talking purposes.
- Okay. Adam, sounds like you're ready to
- 25 go.

Page 17 (The prehearing proceedings, continuances, 1 dismissals and scheduling, conclude, 8:46 2 3 a.m.) (2:39 p.m.) 4 5 EXAMINER JONES: We wanted to make sure that a few cases that we heard the disbursement on 6 7 during the day, at least we have it on the record. 8 The Kaiser-Francis cases, those are numbers 9 18 through 25 on the docket. I think it's Cases 20286, 20287, 20288, 20289, 20290, 20291, 20292 and 20293. 10 11 Those are continued to May the 30th. 12 And also, Mr. Bruce, I understand we're dismissing Case 16231, which is number 75 on the docket? 13 14 MR. BRUCE: Yes. That should be dismissed. EXAMINER JONES: Dismiss that case. 15 16 And -- excuse me. I can't talk today. 17 And, Mr. Warnell, did you want to talk 18 about Case --19 EXAMINER WARNELL: Was that 78, 79 and 80? 20 EXAMINER JONES: Yeah, 78, 79 and 80. EXAMINER WARNELL: Cases 16221, 16434 and 21

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those cases were heard -- they were on the docket for

the 29th of November last year. They were continued to

EXAMINER JONES: Okay. For the record,

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16184 have been dismissed.

1 January 24th, and they were further continued from there

- 2 to this docket. And because of the number of
- 3 continuances, the director has decided to dismiss the
- 4 cases without prejudice for reapplying. We still have
- 5 the other two cases that were heard on that date,
- 6 November 29th, under advisement. Scott Dawson has them,
- 7 and he's working on them right now. And he did send an
- 8 email out yesterday to confirm that those two cases are
- 9 still needed. They were, I think, your cases.
- 10 MR. BRUCE: I'm sure they were. They are
- 11 still needed because they -- they pertain to different
- 12 land than these.
- 13 EXAMINER JONES: Different land. So they
- 14 weren't contested.
- 15 MR. RANKIN: I trust counsel's assessment.
- 16 MR. BRUCE: I think they were in the north
- 17 half of a section or two, and these cases are in the
- 18 south half.
- 19 MR. RANKIN: Sounds right, but I can't --
- 20 MR. BRUCE: So Mr. Rankin and I will
- 21 just -- the parties are negotiating with -- probably
- 22 have to refile.
- MR. RANKIN: That much, I can confirm.
- 24 EXAMINER JONES: And the other thing I
- 25 wanted to make sure we brought up is Cases 81 and 82,

1 which is Mewbourne versus Percussion, those -- we talked

- 2 earlier about continuing those to May 16th. We have a
- 3 little concern because we have to get the whole docket
- 4 done in one day that day, because Sharon and Jim and, I
- 5 guess, EOG was in that, too.
- 6 MR. BRUCE: Whatever works with the
- 7 Division is fine with me.
- 8 EXAMINER GOETZE: That's a dangerous
- 9 precedent.
- 10 (Laughter.)
- 11 EXAMINER JONES: Leave it up to
- 12 Mr. Warnell.
- 13 EXAMINER BROOKS: Leave it in his capable
- 14 hands.
- 15 EXAMINER WARNELL: Continued to a future
- 16 date.
- 17 EXAMINER JONES: Anyway, that was our
- 18 concern. So I don't think May 16th --
- MR. BRUCE: Will work.
- 20 EXAMINER JONES: I don't think we can do it
- 21 there because it might take three hours for that matter
- 22 or so.
- MS. SHAHEEN: Would May 30th work?
- 24 EXAMINER BROOKS: Didn't we set something
- 25 on May 30th?

1 EXAMINER JONES: Deana might have something

- 2 tied up here. May 16th, also there was this other case,
- 3 this Marathon-Mewbourne matter.
- 4 Terry, what did you decide on that?
- 5 EXAMINER WARNELL: We can take that up with
- 6 the four of us when we're done.
- 7 EXAMINER JONES: We can do that. Gabe kind
- 8 of wanted things to be on the record.
- 9 EXAMINER WARNELL: Oh, okay.
- 10 (Laughter.)
- 11 MS. BENNETT: I guess my question about
- 12 that was really -- so we had set May 17th for the
- 13 Mewbourne Little Giant, Little Rascals, Homework Larry
- 14 and Duda Bides. And I believe that there is some
- 15 Holland & Hart involvement in that scenario, but I can't
- 16 really say for sure. And so we had agreed on May 17th
- 17 as the date for that contested hearing, but now I
- 18 understand that the Commission changed its hearing date
- 19 to May 17th.
- 20 EXAMINER WARNELL: Yes.
- 21 MS. BENNETT: But -- and maybe there are
- 22 other countervailing things that Mr. Bruce would like to
- 23 say about that.
- MR. BRUCE: Not really.
- MS. BENNETT: Okay.

1 MR. BRUCE: I think we probably better

- 2 consult with our clients about potential dates and get
- 3 that to Mr. Warnell.
- 4 EXAMINER GOETZE: That would be fine. But
- 5 it does look like May 16th -- because we're not even
- 6 through May 2nd yet, and there might be something
- 7 critical on May 2nd to go through.
- 8 MS. BENNETT: Uh-huh. All of my cases are
- 9 critical.
- 10 (Laughter.)
- 11 MR. BRUCE: Do you want expedited orders on
- 12 those?
- 13 (Laughter.)
- MS. BENNETT: Yeah. That would be fine.
- 15 Move to the 30th and then figure out the dates after
- 16 that so they're at least continued to a specific date,
- 17 because right now, they're just floating in limbo.
- 18 EXAMINER WARNELL: Or place them on the
- 19 June 27th.
- 20 EXAMINER GOETZE: Whoa.
- MR. BRUCE: What's that now?
- 22 EXAMINER WARNELL: Going to June 27th.
- MR. BRUCE: June?

- 1 (Laughter.)

- 4 mark it, down I'll check with my clients.
- 5 MS. BENNETT: Well, that's just the date
- 6 we're continuing them to. That's not the date we would
- 7 be discussing as a potential date for a hearing, just
- 8 so -- I mean, am I right about that? Would that be the
- 9 hearing date you're proposing?
- 10 EXAMINER WARNELL: That's the hearing date
- 11 I'm proposing. We wouldn't hear them before that.
- 12 EXAMINER GOETZE: Remember, he's a contract
- 13 person. He may go away at any time, but we'll bring him
- 14 back because he does a good job.
- 15 (Laughter.)
- MS. BENNETT: Yeah. I'm smiling.
