HEARING EXAMINER LOWE: Good morning. This is OCD Hearing Docket Number 42-19. Today is November 14, 2019. We are on the record; we will conduct today's hearings.

My name is Leonard Lowe and I will be your Hearing Examiner today. Today with me we have our attorney Eric Ames, Phillip Goetze helping us out, and Kathleen Murphy and an elite team on that side over there.

This morning I'm going to have Kathleen call out the dismissals and continuances that we were made aware of prior to today's docket. Ms. Murphy.

EXAMINER MURPHY: The following cases are
dismissed: Case 20828, Ridge Runner; Case 20815, Novo Oil \&
Gas; 20816, Novo Oil \& Gas; 20890, Devon Energy; 20900,
Black River Water Management; 20901 Texland Petroleum; 20849
Kaiser-Francis; 20850, Kaiser-Francis; 20851,
Kaiser-Francis; 20852, Kaiser-Francis; 20853,

Kaiser-Francis; 20912, BTA Oil, and 20913.

The following cases have been continued. I will read the case number, and the date that they are continued to tentatively.

The following cases are continued to December 12, 2019, and those are cases 20856, COG, and 20857, also COG.

The following case is continued to January 23, 2020, and that is Case 20827 Advanced Energy Partner.

The following cases are continued to February 2 -- February 20, 2020. These are all Marathon Oil Permian LLC cases, 20840, 20841, 20842, 20843, 20844, 20845, 20846, 20847, 20848 .

Also to February 20, 2020, 20830 Centennial
Resources; 20831, Centennial Resources; 20833, Titus Oil \& Gas; 20834, Titus Oil \& Gas; 20835, Titus Oil \& Gas; 20817 Novo Oil \& Gas Northern Delaware; 20861, VF Petroleum; 20862 VF Petroleum; 20873, Novo Oil \& Gas Northern Delaware; 20874, Novo Oil \& Gas Northern Delaware; 20876, COG Operating; 20877, COG Operating; 20878, Titus Oil \& Gas; 20879, titus Oil \& Gas; 20880, Titus Oil \& Gas and 20881 Titus Oil \& Gas.

And also continued to February 20, 2020; 20882, Titus Oil \& Gas; 20897, Titus Oil \& Gas; 20898, Titus Oil \& Gas; 20899, Titus Oil \& Gas.

And then the rest of these are Matador Production: 20904, 20905, 20906, 20907, 20908, 20909, 20910 and 20911.

Those are the continuances and dismissals that we have at this time. Are there any additions or subtractions to that?
(No audible response.)
HEARING EXAMINER LOWE: Thank you, Kathleen. Thank you. All righty then. Can I just -- items.

MR. AMES: So, Counsel, we have taken the liberty of ordering the remaining 42 cases on the docket, and we have a spreadsheet that we would like to distribute which shows the order we will take the cases. We will show how we are going to do.

I only have 12 copies, so if $I$ can hit primary counsel, there are a few $I$ know who has cases on the docket.

EXAMINER MURPHY: Eric, there are copies in the back.

MR. AMES: I grabbed them. Who else needs a copy? I have a few more. Other counsel? Next time we will make more copies. Kathleen suggested that earlier. Sorry Kathleen.

Anybody else? There's a couple of extra copies. Who else needs a copy? Well, there is two more here if you folks want them. I guess we do have enough. So you will notice that the cases are numbered 1 to 42. All the hearings are at the end from 38 to 42.

We will have a discussion after the conclusion of the cases 1 through 37 about the order in which we will take the hearings. My understanding is that some counsel have issues with witnesses tomorrow, and so we will need to have a discussion among the counsel for the cases set for hearing on how best to take them.

In terms of the remaining cases, you will notice
on the right side it says, in the last column, affidavit or hearing. Cases 1 through 25 have no other entries of appearance or notices of intervention, and those will be taken by affidavit in the order given.

Cases 26 through 37 say TBD, that is because there are entries of appearance in those cases and in at least a couple of them there are prehearing statements filed. I have talked to counsel for both the applicants and for the parties, and it's my understanding those cases can also proceed by affidavit, and so we will take them in the order given there.

What we would like to do is, in taking the cases by affidavit, is follow the process which we initiated in the last round of hearings, which is to have counsel make their appearances, have counsel for the applicant introduce themselves, the name of their applicant, maybe one or two sentences about the case, and then a very brief description of the exhibits, ask us to accept the exhibits into the record, and take the case under consideration, and then we will move on.

I am hoping that if we keep to a streamlined approach, we can move through these 37 cases quickly. If any issues arise during the presentation of a case where counsel has an issue, just raise it and we'll address it in that content.

So unless there is anything general that anyone wants to raise regarding this process, we'll jump right in and start with Mr. Feldewert.

MR. RANKIN: Mr. Examiner, one point of clarification, a couple of these are listed as affidavit cases when in fact we have live witnesses. I just want to make that point so you are not surprised.

MR. AMES: You intend to present live witnesses?
MR. RANKIN: Yes.

MR. AMES: Which cases are those?

MR. RANKIN: Looking at your list, it's case numbers 19 through 22 that, in fact, will be presented by live witness.

MR. AMES: Okay. Anyone else?
MR. RANKIN: And then, Mr. Ames, case number 26 on your list, it's an affidavit case. It was with the consent of the State Land Office.

MS. ANTILLON: The State Land Office concurs.

MR. AMES: So Mr. Rankin, we are going to move 19 through 22 to the very end of the cases by affidavit, and we'll consider the order of presentation of those hearings when we get there.

All right.
(Cases by affidavit presented and taken under advisement.)

HEARING EXAMINER LOWE: We are going to take a ten-minute break while we discuss our next case, and we'll convene here in about ten minutes.
(Recess taken.)

HEARING EXAMINER LOWE: We are back on the record.

MR. AMES: To all the counsel this morning, we were able to go through -- process 30 cases in three hours. That seems pretty good. There is two more cases pending by affidavit, and Mr. Bruce has agreed that they will be heard tomorrow morning at 8:15.

We have ten cases for hearing. There has been a discussion and agreement amongst counsel to the order of presentation.

We are going to begin with NGL 20896 slash 16507. We will then probably break for lunch around 12 and then -well, we may start, if we can pick up the COG Case 20832 and then break for lunch.

Start after lunch with Texland Petroleum 20894 and then move to the Hilcorp trio of cases, 20891, 92 and 93. And then finally, we will hear Marathon 20865,20866 and then Novo 20916 and 20917. Any objections?
