Item 1. Roll Call.

Case No. 20779: Application of Lucid Energy Delaware, LLC for authority to inject, Lea County, New Mexico.

Action:

Commissioner Engler made a motion to adopt Order No. R-20916-H in Case No. 20779. Commissioner Kessler seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken.

Item 5.

Case 21469: Application for Rulemaking: Pursuant to 19.15.38(A) NMAC, Petitioner WildEarth Guardians ("Guardians") hereby petitions the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission ("OCC") to amend 19.15.34.20 NMAC – Disposition of Produced Water and Other Oil Field Waste – a rule "to regulate the disposition, handling, transport, storage, recycling, treatment and disposal of produced water … in a manner that protects public health, the environment and fresh water resources." NMSA 1978, § 70-2- 12(B)(15). Currently, OCC/OCD rules do not prohibit spills or releases or produced water. The proposed rule would fill that glaring regulatory hole by specifically prohibiting the spilling or releasing of produced water. Upon application of WildEarth Guardians, the Oil Conservation Commission will review the request to grant a hearing on the rulemaking.

Action:

Appearances were made by Daniel Timmons for WildEarth Guardians, Adam Rankin for the New Mexico Oil & Gas Association, and Eric Ames for the Oil Conservation Division.

Mr. Timmons explained the purpose of the application and requested a November hearing date. A discussion was held by the Commission and all parties. Commissioner Engler made a motion to deny the application because it cited the wrong rule. There was no second. Commissioner Kessler made a motion to accept the application and set it for hearing. Chair Sandoval seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken.

Commissioner Engler – No Commissioner Kessler – Yes Chair Sandoval – Yes

The motion passed by majority vote.

A discussion was held on a special hearing date for the application. The Commission agreed to set it for April 1 and 2, and 8 and 9, 2020, if needed. Commissioner Kessler moved that the comment period for this case be 60 days, Commissioner Engler seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken.
