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Page 3 1 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Let's move to a long set 2 of cases. Let's see, 21362, 21363, 21634, those are Mewbourne Oil matters relating to a well named Sidecar. 3 4 21393, 21394, Ascent Energy is the applicant there relating to a well named Anvil. 5 And then 21489, 21490 and 21491, Apache 6 7 Corporation, the applicant there for a well named Taco. So 8 all of these matters are on the docket this morning for 9 status conference. 10 Let's do appearances. Ms. Hardy, is that you for Mewbourne? 11 12 MS. HARDY: Yes, it is, Madam Examiner. Dana 13 Hardy for Mewbourne. 14 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Thank you. And then we 15 have Abadie & Schill for Ascent. MR. SAVAGE: Yes, Madam Examiner, Darin Savage 16 17 for Ascent. We also have present Bill Zimsky from our Durango office. 18 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Thank you. Good morning. 19 And then Modrall Sperling for Apache. 20 MR. DEBRINE: Good morning, Madam Examiner, Earl 21 Debrine with Modrall Sperling for Apache. 22 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Terrific. And are there 23 24 any other appearances this morning? 25 (No audible response.)

Page 4 1 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: No? All right. So you may have heard me offer up the available -- the next 2 available dates we have. 3 4 Since this will be many hours of a hearing, we may want to look at May. Otherwise we have some 5 availability on March 18, but you would not be the only 6 hearing. I did see folks submitting exhibits and such. 7 We 8 can certainly set a new date for the prehearing process with 9 a new hearing date. Who would like to start us off? 10 Oh, wait, Mr. Padilla, are you among the -wait, Mr. Padilla? 11 12 MR. PADILLA: Yes. I would like to enter an 13 appearance for EOG Resources in all of its cases. We have 14 been in these cases since the beginning. And we are only 15 entering an appearance. We haven't taken an active role in these cases, but nonetheless, EOG simply wants to preserve 16 17 its appellate rights should that be necessary. HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. Well, thank 18 you, Mr. Padilla. I'm sorry I didn't see -- I didn't see 19 you until now. All right. 20 21 So who would like to start us off? 22 MR. HARDY: Madam Examiner, I can start, if you would like. 23 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. Ms. Hardy. 2.4 25 MS. HARDY: With respect to hearing date, I think

Page 5 this hearing will take quite a while based on the number of 1 2 witnesses who have been identified, and so it seems to me 3 that subject to my witnesses' availability the May date will 4 probably make the most sense. 5 I personally am going out of town on March 19, so I doubt this case would be finished following another 6 7 hearing on the 18th. So it seems to me we are probably looking at May, if those are the earliest dates available 8 9 other than March. 10 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: They are. We have something like -- many, many cases already on the April 11 12 date, just can't squeeze another one in there. All right. 13 Mr. Debrine? 14 MR. DEBRINE: Yes, Madam Examiner, both of the 15 May dates you mentioned work on counsel's calendar. I would need to confer with Apache. I have an e-mail in to them, 16 17 and we may have more information before we are done here, 18 but those look good for counsel. HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. Mr. Savage? 19 MR. SAVAGE: Yes, Madam Examiner, can you repeat 20 two dates in May? 21 22 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: May 6 and May 20. 23 MR. SAVAGE: Those look like they may be 24 available for us. I would have to confer with the client on 25 that to confirm, but I will mark this down and we will get

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1 back to you very promptly.

2 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. So if each of 3 you would submit an e-mail copying all the rest of us 4 confirming your availability on one of the May dates, I can 5 get a prehearing order out as soon as I have heard from each 6 of you.

7 So is there anything else we need to talk about 8 while we are together? Typically, as you know, the exhibits 9 would be due the Thursday before, objections would be due 10 that Tuesday before. Are there any other dates we need to 11 be talking about?

12 MR. DEBRINE: Madam Examiner, you had suggested 13 that we have a -- maybe we set a hearing date for a 14 prehearing to address the objections in advance of the 15 hearing, I think that might be useful. Given that the parties have already submitted their exhibits, I think any 16 time that the parties are available would work to address 17 any objections. We would just need a date a week in advance 18 of the hearing to file objections. 19

HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. How about this: When you send your e-mail confirming your availability of your witnesses' availability for one of the May dates, propose a good date to get together for the objections, to file those objections, and then we can get together on a teleconference or on an earlier virtual

Page 7 session to address them if you would like. 1 2 MR. DEBRINE: Yeah, that works fine. HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: No problem with 3 4 flexibility there. MS. HARDY: Madam Examiner, I wanted to raise one 5 issue briefly. I know the parties have submitted a 6 statement about disputed facts, and I'm not sure yet, I 7 8 believe that I may need to correct an error in the statement, but I'm trying to confirm that with Mewbourne, 9 10 and I haven't been able to reach them because of the power outage situation. So I just wanted to point that out so 11 12 that no one is surprised later, but I may need to make a 13 correction in it and it involves Mewbourne's interest in 14 Apache's spacing units. 15 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: Well, thank you for raising that. Is there another topic we should talk about 16 17 before you confer with your client on dates? 18 MR. DEBRINE: None for Apache. HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: No? 19 20 MS. HARDY: No, Madam Examiner. 21 HEARING EXAMINER ORTH: All right. Thank you all very much then. I will look for your e-mails and we'll get 22 23 a prehearing order out as soon as I hear from you. 24 MR. DEBRINE: Thank you. 25 MS. HARDY: Thank you.
