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1 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: So now we are looking

- 2 at item, what appears to be Items 10, 11, 12, Franklin
- 3 Mountain, this would be Case Numbers 21803, 21804, 21805 for
- 4 Franklin.
- 5 MS. BENNETT: Good morning, Mr. Examiner. This
- 6 is Deana Bennett on behalf of Franklin Mountain Energy LLC.
- 7 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. And then
- 8 I see Max and Starboard.
- 9 MR. RANKIN: Good morning, Mr. Examiner, Adam
- 10 Rankin with the law firm of Holland & Hart appearing on
- 11 behalf of both Max Permian and Starboard.
- 12 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you.
- 13 Burlington?
- MS. HARDY: Yes, Mr. Examiner, Dana Hardy with
- 15 the Santa Fe office of Hinkle Shanor on behalf of Burlington
- 16 Resources Oil & Gas Company LLP.
- 17 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Any other entries of
- 18 appearance in these three matters?
- 19 (No audible response.)
- 20 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Hearing none, Ms.
- 21 Bennett?
- 22 MS. BENNETT: These three cases were originally
- 23 set for the April 8 docket, and Burlington, Max Permian and
- 24 Starboard requested that we continue the cases to the April
- 25 22 docket. And Franklin Mountain Energy has been in ongoing

1 negotiations with all three parties, and I don't think that

- 2 there is any further objection from Burlington, but I will
- 3 let Ms. Hardy weigh in on that.
- 4 They didn't ask for a continuance or object to
- 5 the cases going by affidavit today. But Max Permian and
- 6 Starboard Permian did object to the cases going by affidavit
- 7 today, and my understanding is that there is some final
- 8 negotiations to be worked out with the parties. And it is
- 9 for that reason that Max Permian and Starboard objected to
- 10 the cases going by affidavit today.
- 11 And Franklin Mountain Energy's position is that
- 12 the cases, while, their goal is to have these cases heard as
- 13 early as possible, and I heard Mr. Examiner saying a moment
- 14 ago saying the earliest date is in June, but hopefully what
- 15 I would like to propose, and I'm obviously interested
- 16 hearing from the other parties and the Division, is a May 20
- 17 date would be my expectation or hope that we would be able
- 18 to put the cases on by affidavit on May 20.
- 19 But I understand that Mr. Rankin's clients aren't
- 20 available on the 20th if there was a contested hearing which
- 21 would be short, then that they would be on May 21. So
- 22 that's sort of where we are from my perspective.
- 23 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Mr. Rankin?
- MR. RANKIN: Thank you, Mr. Examiner. Yes, at
- 25 this point the parties are working towards a resolution and

- 1 with the expectation that we'll achieve an agreement in
- 2 advance of any hearing date. Ms. Bennett is correct that my
- 3 witnesses will not be available for a May 20 hearing,
- 4 however, they would be available for a May 21 hearing.
- I do not expect that a hearing, because there are
- 6 no competing counter-proposals or well development plans,
- 7 that it would be a long, drawn-out hearing if it were
- 8 necessary to, to present the case with live witnesses or
- 9 contested. So I do expect, even if it were contested, that
- 10 it wouldn't take too long, which we should be able to do it
- 11 in a relatively short order.
- 12 So with that said, we would be willing to
- 13 accommodate Franklin Mountain to try to get the case set on
- 14 the 21st with the expectation that if it were not contested,
- 15 that it could be heard by affidavit on the 20th.
- 16 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Okay. That's a
- 17 little confusing here. Ms. Hardy, do you have any
- 18 objections to proceeding in this manner?
- 19 MS. HARDY: No, Mr. Examiner, not from
- 20 Burlington.
- 21 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Okay. Well, then we
- 22 will set the case for May 20 on the assumption that you all
- 23 will work it out and it will go by affidavit. And if not,
- 24 we will figure it out. If it's not going to go by
- 25 affidavit, we need to have plenty of advance notice in

1 advance of May 20 because right now nothing is scheduled for

- 2 May 21.
- 3 MR. RANKIN: To be clear, in the past, and it's
- 4 not common, but because that second day of hearing on Friday
- 5 is reserved, we have set a contested case for the 20th where
- 6 if that first day of hearing where the witnesses are not
- 7 available, the expectation or understanding it would be
- 8 heard on the second day of that hearing.
- 9 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Okay. We will set it
- 10 on the 20th with an option to continue it to the 21st. How
- 11 is that?
- MR. RANKIN: Thank you.
- MS. BENNETT: Thank you.
- MS. HARDY: Thank you.
- 15 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: So, Ms. Bennett, you
- 16 will file the continuances for the 20th?
- 17 MS. BENNETT: I'm actually going to rely on Mr.
- 18 Rankin to file the continuances for the 20th, but if we need
- 19 to talk about that, we will talk about it off the record.
- 20 But I do appreciate the confirmation that we do need to file
- 21 continuances because I was going to ask that very question.
- 22 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Anything
- 23 else on these cases?
- MS. BENNETT: Not for me. Thank you very much.
- 25 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you.
