- 1 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: And with that, I'd
- 2 like to start the hearings today. On your docket that is on
- 3 the website, these will be cases 1 through 7. Case numbers
- 4 are 20132, 20133, 20134, Marathon Oil Permian, and 20630,
- 5 20631, 20632, 20633 Oxy USA. So entry for Marathon Oil?
- 6 MS. BENNETT: (Inaudible.)
- 7 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Deana, I believe you
- 8 are muted.
- 9 MS. BENNETT: (Inaudible.)
- 10 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: We still cannot hear
- 11 you. Ms. Bennett, is this your way of making an argument?
- 12 (Discussion regarding audio problems.)
- 13 MS. BENNETT: I'm here. Can you hear me now?
- 14 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: We can hear you now.
- 15 MS. BENNETT: Great. I'm not entirely sure what
- 16 that was all about, but I appreciate your patience with the
- 17 every day different audio, different audio issues keeps us
- 18 flexible; right? Deana Bennett on behalf of Marathon Oil
- 19 Permian, LLC. Thank you.
- 20 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Oxy USA?
- 21 MS. LUCK: Good morning, Kaitlyn Luck with the
- 22 Santa Fe office of Holland & Hart for Oxy USA Inc.
- 23 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: And I believe EOG
- 24 Resources is also on the Oxy case.
- MR. RITTENHOUSE: This is Joby Rittenhouse from

- 1 Beatty & Wozniak on behalf of EOG Resources.
- 2 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Are there any other
- 3 entries of appearances for these seven cases that I
- 4 mentioned?
- 5 (No response.)
- 6 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Hearing none, you may
- 7 wonder why I have gathered you all here this morning since
- 8 you just filed motions to continue as you have for the past
- 9 two and a half years. So that's why you are here. I sort
- 10 of need a reason to know why we should continue with this
- 11 without the Division simply dismissing these cases for lack
- 12 of action.
- 13 Where are we going with this, Ms. Bennett?
- MS. BENNETT: Thank you. Well, so I appreciate
- the Division's interests in the cases and certainly
- 16 understand -- I predicted this is why we were here today
- 17 given the length of time that the cases have been on the
- 18 docket.
- 19 And I did reach out to Marathon, and I know Ms.
- 20 Luck reached out to Oxy to discuss the status of the cases.
- 21 And it's my understanding that the parties have been and are
- 22 continuing to be in negotiations about a trade. And if the
- 23 trade is successful, that would mean one the parties would
- 24 be out of the other party's hair allowing the cases to move
- 25 forward more smoothly in front of the Division.

1 As you noted, these cases have been on the docket

- 2 for a couple of years, but in the intervening year we did
- 3 have Covid which caused unanticipated delays, as well as
- 4 both the companies did some restructuring as a result of
- 5 some of the changes in the market conditions which also, as
- 6 I understand it, sort of impacted continuity of the
- 7 discussions, but they are back in full swing now.
- 8 In fact when I was talking with -- communicating
- 9 with Marathon today, the parties had been in regular
- 10 discussions since February, multiple discussions in June,
- 11 and discussions as recently as July 13.
- 12 So they are working diligently towards a
- 13 resolution and have been using the time they've had to try
- 14 to get resolution. I understand there's been some title
- 15 work, curative title work that needed to take place, and
- 16 Marathon has been pursuing that curative title work during
- 17 this period as well.
- 18 So there are a lot of moving parts that have been
- 19 in the background, and the goal, though, is to resolve
- 20 the -- for Marathon and Oxy to resolve their differences
- 21 outside of the OCD process to make the OCD hearing hopefully
- 22 uncontested when it does happen.
- 23 So that's why there's been multiple continuances
- 24 is because the parties are continuing to negotiate in good
- 25 faith and work through the trade process.

1 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Ms. Luck,

- 2 anything to add to that?
- 3 MS. LUCK: I'm generally in agreement (garbled
- 4 audio) is another reason for the delay is that there was
- 5 some (garbled audio) involving BTA that were caught up in
- 6 this acreage but then they fell out because they won an
- 7 appeal of a Marathon court order.
- 8 So there have been some like shifting title
- 9 issues, like Ms. Bennett mentioned, so because of that this
- 10 has been prolonged but the parties do intend to keep working
- 11 towards this agreement. I mean I know there a are lot
- 12 (garbled audio) and they are still talking.
- 13 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Mr. Rittenhouse, any
- 14 comments?
- 15 MR. RITTENHOUSE: Nothing from EOG. EOG at this
- 16 point entered an appearance to preserve their rights,
- 17 similarly engaged in discussions with Oxy in this case for a
- 18 trade. So nothing beyond that.
- 19 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Okay,
- 20 that's helpful. It sounds like we are hopefully going to
- 21 resolve this. At this point the parties do not seem to want
- 22 to set up a contested hearing date, so I have not written
- 23 down what you asked for for a continuance.
- Does anyone recall what date you asked for?
- 25 MS. BENNETT: We asked for September 23.

Page 7 1 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Okay. We will grant that continuance on the assumption these negotiations are 2 ongoing, that we are not really setting up a contested 3 hearing on September 23 because we have no room for a 5 contested hearing on September 23. So with that, these cases will be continued and 6 7 we will move forward. Thank you for the information. 8 Appreciate it. 9 MS. BENNETT: Thank you very much. 10 MS. LUCK: Thank you. HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: That's a fair warning 11 12 to folks.
