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Page 3 1 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Okay. So the last 2 five cases on our docket today were scheduled as a contested 3 hearing, but perhaps that's not what we are going to have 4 here right now, so let's find out. I'm going to call Cases 21063, 21064, 21065, 5 20988, 20989, with a request for dismissal was filed for 6 7 Cases 20988 and 20989. So let's start with Matador 8 Production. 9 MR. BRUCE: Jim Bruce entering on appearance on 10 behalf of Matador Production Company. MR. PADILLA: Mr. Examiner, Ernest L. Padilla for 11 12 Ostrich Oil & Gas LLC. 13 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. 14 ConocoPhillips? 15 MR. FELDEWERT: May it please the Examiner, Michael Feldewert of the Santa Fe office of Holland & Hart 16 17 appearing on behalf of ConocoPhillips. 18 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: All right. Does ConocoPhillips have witnesses or wants to contest this case? 19 20 MR. FELDEWERT: We do not. 21 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: And you have no objection to this case going forward by affidavit? 22 23 MR. FELDEWERT: We do not. 24 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: All right. Mr. Padilla. 25

Page 4 MR. PADILLA: Mr. Examiner, Ostrich Oil & Gas and 1 2 Matador settled their dispute, therefore we dismissed our 3 competing applications, and so we have nothing more to say. 4 And no, no objection to an affidavit case by Matador. 5 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Are there 6 any other interested persons then in cases 21063, 21064, 7 21065? 8 (No response.) 9 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Hearing none, Mr. 10 Bruce, you may proceed? MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner in Case 063, Matador 11 12 seeks to force pool the Bone Spring Formation in the W/2 W/213 of Section 3 and the W/2 W/2 of Section 10, 22 South, 32 14 East in Lea County for the purpose of drilling two wells. 15 In Case 064, they seek to force pool the E/2 W/2 of Section 3 and the E/2 W/2 of Section 10 in the Bone 16 17 Spring Formation for the purpose of drilling three wells. And then 065, they seek to force pool the 18 Wolfcamp Formation in the E/2 W/2 of Section 3 and the E/219 W/2 of Section 10 for the purpose of drilling a Wolfcamp 20 21 well. 22 When you look at the exhibits, I had a devil of a 23 time getting everything to upload and go onto the OCD's 24 E-permitting website, so I had to break it up into the 25 affidavits, et cetera, the exhibits into three parts.

Page 5 The first one is an affidavit covering all three 1 2 cases from the landman Chris Carlton, contains all the usual information with AFEs, the C-102s, the proposal letters' 3 4 breakdown of interest ownership and copies of proposal letters. It contains all the usual information that is 5 Exhibit A. 6 Exhibit B-1 is my affidavit of notice. 7 8 And Exhibit B-2 is an affidavit of publication. All parties did receive either actual or publication notice 9 10 of the case. There are several notice letters because after I had sent out my initial proposal letter, a couple of 11 12 additional people were added to the notice list, so I think 13 there are, in total, three notice letters. And the parties 14 being notified differed slightly from the W/2 W/2 of the 15 sections to the E/2 W/2 of these sections, but everyone did receive notice. 16 17 Exhibit C is the geologist affidavit, and it contains all the usual structure map, cross section, and the 18 usual information that the Division likes to see. 19 Exhibit D contains all the applications and 20 21 proposed notices. 22 And Exhibit E contains three pooling checklists, one for each case. And once again, I believe all the 23 24 information the Division usually requires is in the exhibit 25 packages, and I would ask that Exhibits A through E in these

Page 6 cases be admitted into evidence and the matters be taken 1 2 under advisement. 3 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. 4 Mr. Feldewert, any objections or questions? MR. FELDEWERT: No objection, Mr. Brancard, and 5 6 no questions. 7 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Mr. 8 Padilla? 9 MR. PADILLA: No, none. 10 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. Once again, are there any other interested persons Cases 21063, 11 12 21064 and 21065. Mr. McClure, any questions? 13 TECHNICAL EXAMINER McCLURE: No, Mr. Brancard, I 14 have no questions regarding these cases. 15 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. And so if I understand, Mr. Bruce, you have everything uploaded in the 16 system that you need? 17 MR. BRUCE: Yes. 18 19 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you. With that the exhibits will be admitted into the record in Cases 20 21063, 064, 065 will be taken under advisement. Thank you. 21 22 (Exhibits admitted.) (Taken under advisement.) 23 24 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: And as noted earlier, 25 Cases 20988 and 20989 have been dismissed. Are there any

Page 7 other matters to come before the Division at this point? 1 2 (No response.) MR. BRUCE: If I may, rather than e-mailing you, 3 4 Mr. Brancard, when you asked for information about what to do with hearings, I had the same thought that you said about 5 6 the Oklahoma Corporation Commission, that when it comes to contested cases, it's a lot easier to present by live 7 8 testimony rather than telephonically or by Zoom, but certainly I see no problem with continuing all of the 9 10 uncontested matters over the phone. They seem to go pretty quickly. 11 12 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Yeah, that means, Mr. 13 Bruce, that we will actually see you live and in person. 14 MR. BRUCE: Well, that's your problem not mine. 15 (Discussion off record.) MR. BRUCE: Thank you for everything, 16 17 Mr. Brancard. 18 HEARING EXAMINER BRANCARD: Thank you, everyone. We had quite an agenda today, but it got done in a very 19 short period of time. So thank you all for working on those 20 cases moving things forward and settling matters as 21 necessary. All right. We will see you all in a few weeks. 22 23 Thank you. 24 (Concluded.) 25
